Assam varsity develops fungal powder to boost immunity

Scientists say the product was made by freeze-drying a 'super mushroom' cultivated in Bodoland University

Bodoland University, one of Assam's youngest universities, says it has developed a fungal powder to help people boost immunity during the time of a global pandemic.

The powder is from a parasitic but rare "super mushroom" called *Cordyceps militaris*.

Like most other universities and specialised institu-

the fungal immunity booster, a membrane mask that costs less than ₹4 per unit, herbal and alcohol-based sanitisers, laser and LED-assisted unmanned sanitisation tunnel, a low-cost physical-cum-chemical sanitisation box and a PPE kit with an aquarium aerator.

Kokrajhar district's former Deputy Commissioner P.P. Mazumdar issued them a special travel pass while Inspector-General of Police An-

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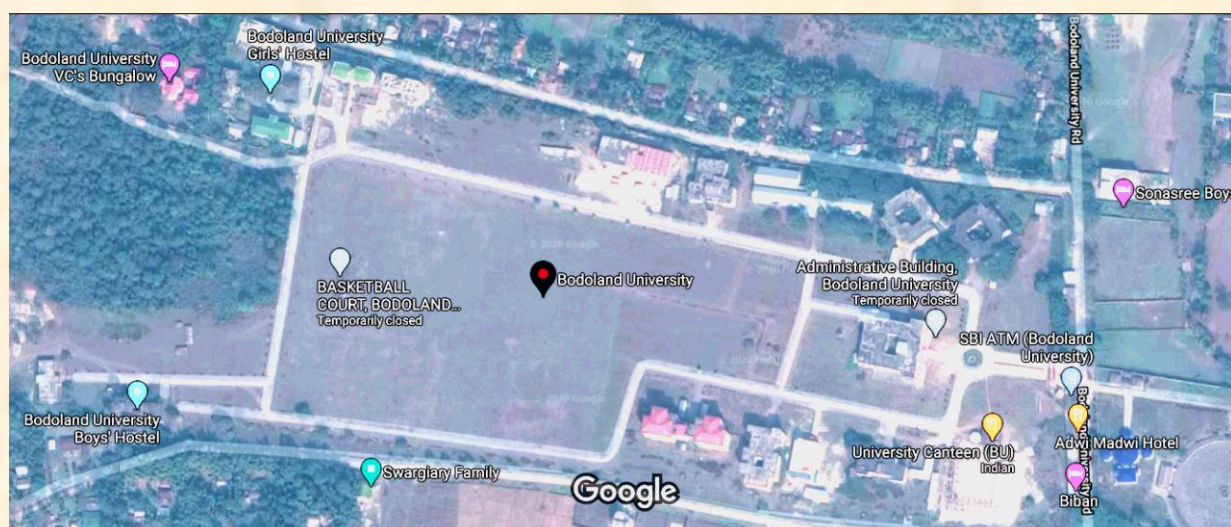
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ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Bodoland University is a state university established by the Bodoland University Act, 2009 of the Assam Legislative Assembly on 28th February 2009. It is one of the growing universities in lower Assam accredited under section 2(f) and 12(B) of UGC Act, 1956. It is the only institution of higher education in the western part of Assam to address the need and concern for all-round development of the region. Bodoland University is committed to the academic development of lower Assam in general and BTAD region in particular. The University not only provides opportunity for higher studies to the populace of this region, it also caters to the educational needs of the adjoining states and neighbouring countries like Bhutan, Nepal and Bangladesh.

At present there are 17 PG Departments and 48 Affiliated Degree Colleges, 4 DIET and 3 B.Ed. Colleges. Bodoland University run the Academic Curriculum following Choice-Based Credit System of UGC. Along with core subjects, Bodoland University also provides Diploma in Bamboo Technology (DBT), Post Graduate Diploma in Human Rights & Education (PGDHRE), and several certificate courses. The Padmashri Modaram Brahma Central Library provides knowledge and wisdom with multifaceted facilities. Besides, the University also has Health Centre, Technology Incubation Centre, Intellectual Property Right Cell, Bus service and Hostel Facilities for students and research scholars.

The picturesque campus of the University is located at Rangalikhata, Debargaon 10 km north from Kokrajhar town. The location of the University makes it possible for students and researchers across the border to conveniently get access to the University. The University is well-connected by surface road network including National Highway 31, Broad-gauge Railway, and Airways at Rupsi Airport (70 km). The international boundary of Bangladesh (110 km) and Bhutan (40 km) and state boundary of West Bengal (45 km) is accessible by roadways. The University has two additional plots of land at Haldibari (3 km) and Subaijhar (1.5 km) for further extension.

2. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

I. ELIGIBILITY FOR M.A. / M.Sc. / M.Com.

- B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. (10+2+3 pattern) with Major / Honours course in the concerned subject with 50% marks.
- Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for reserved quota (SC / ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not be applicable to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.

II. ELIGIBILITY FOR M.Sc. COMPUTER SCIENCE & INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

- B.Sc. (10+2+3 pattern) with Major / Honours course in the concerned subject.
- B.C.A / B.Sc. (IT) (10+2+3 pattern) with Mathematical Science in 10+2 level.
- B.Sc. (in the 10+2+3 pattern) with Computer Science / Information Technology as a pass course / elective subject.
- B.Sc. (10+2+3 pattern) with General Pass course with one year Computer Diploma (Post-Graduate) from recognized institute and Mathematical Sciences in (10+2) level.
- B.E. / B.Tech. (CSE or IT)
- Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not be applicable to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.

III. ELIGIBILITY FOR M.Sc. BIOTECHNOLOGY

- Science Graduate having Honours in any of the Biological Sciences with 50% marks or equivalent Grade.
- Pass course students with minimum of 50% marks or equivalent grade having at least one biological subject in their course combination.
- Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not be applicable to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.

IV. ELIGIBILITY FOR DBT (DIPLOMA IN BAMBOO TECHNOLOGY)

H.S. passed (any stream).

V. ELIGIBILITY FOR M.B.A.

- A Bachelor Degree of 10+2+3 pattern with a minimum of 50% marks or equivalent grade in aggregate or in Major/Honours subject (if any) from any recognized University.
- Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not be applicable to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.

VI. ELIGIBILITY FOR M.C.A.

- (a) Candidates having BCA / B.Sc. / B.Com. / B.A. with mathematics at 10+2 level or at Graduation Level obtained at least 50% marks.
- (b) Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not be applicable to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.

VII. ELIGIBILITY FOR PGDHRE

- (a) Graduate in any discipline with 45% marks or equivalent grade.
- (b) Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not be applicable to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.

VIII. ELIGIBILITY FOR B.Ed.

- (a) Graduate or equivalent from any recognized university with at least 50% mark in aggregate.
- (b) In case of an applicant failed to secure 50% in UG course, then candidates must secure 55% in PG course.
- (c) Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for reserved quota (SC / ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not be applicable to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.
- (d) Teachers deputed by the Govt. of Assam for the course must submit study leave certificate / No Objection Certificate from their concern employers along with the application.

IX. ELIGIBILITY FOR M.Ed.

- (a) B.Ed. / B.T. of Bodoland University or any other university recognised by this university with at least 55% marks in aggregate as per latest NCTE norms.
- (b) Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for reserved quota (SC / ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not be applicable to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.
- (c) Teachers deputed by the Govt. of Assam for the course must submit study leave certificate / No Objection Certificate from their concern employers along with the application.

X. CERTIFICATE COURSE IN BODO

- (a) Graduate in any discipline with 45% marks or equivalent grade.
- (b) Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not be applicable to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.

XI. ELIGIBILITY FOR M.Phil.

Admission to the M.Phil. Programme shall be done as per vacancies. Any person with at least 55% marks or equivalent Grade (50% marks or equivalent Grade in case of SC/ST candidates) in a Master's Degree of any University / Institution recognized by the UGC (Recognised Statutory Body for Foreign Students) in concerned and allied subjects. All candidates shall have to appear in the admission test followed by personal interview to be conducted by the concerned Department.

XII. ELIGIBILITY FOR PhD

Admission to the PhD Programme shall be done preferably in the beginning of academic year. Any person with at least 55% marks or equivalent Grade (50% mark equivalent Grade in case of SC/ST candidates) in a Master's Degree of any University / Institution recognized by the UGC (Recognised Statutory Body for Foreign Students) in concerned and allied subjects. All candidates shall have to appear in the admission test followed by personal interview to be conducted by the concerned Department.

3. RESERVATION QUOTA

- (a) 80% seats will be reserved for the students of affiliated colleges of Bodoland University and remaining 20% is open for admission on merit basis to the students of all recognised university including Bodoland University.
- (b) Reservation of seats for the students belonging in different categories will be as per the Government Rules mentioned below.

- 1. BU Employee's son, daughter, and spouse: 2 (two) seats in each department (in addition to intake capacity).

ADMISSION ON THE BASIS OF SPORTS / EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

For admission against the quota allotted for extra-curricular activities like Cultural, Sports, NCC, Scouts & Guides, the candidates will have to furnish the requisite documents.

A few seats (not more than two) may be offered by the concerned Department for admission to M.A. / M.Sc. /M.B.A. / M.C.A. / M.Com. / M.Ed. / B.Ed. courses to students within intake capacity who have shown extraordinary proficiency in extracurricular activities in the last three years preceding graduation. Any sport / event

organized by an association must be recognized by and affiliated to the national body for that sport / event and by Indian Olympic Association.

Preference will be given to candidates in the following order:

- a) Those who have represented the country in the International events;
- b) Those who have represented their states in the National/International events;
- c) Those who have represented their institutions in International/National events;
- d) Those who have won prizes at recognized International/National level events;
- e) Those who have won prizes at recognized State level competitions;
- f) Those who have represented the University in N.S.S. Camp at the National level; and
- g) Those who have obtained NCC 'C' Certificates or participated in the Republic Day Parade at National level under NCC.

5. HOW TO APPLY

1. The candidate is required to go through the online prospectus carefully and acquaint with all the requirements before filling the online Application Form.
2. A candidate is allowed to submit separate applications for separate Departments.
3. Scanned copy (PDF format) of the original certificates / documents should be uploaded:
 - i) Degree mark-sheets (as indicated in the online Application Form)
 - (a) *For Three-year UG course*: Candidates who have cleared 5th semester examination need to upload all the mark-sheets up to 5th semester.
 - (b) *For Four-year UG course (BE, B.Tech, etc)*: Candidates who have cleared 7th semester examination need to upload all the mark-sheets up to 7th semester.
 - (c) Candidates who have passed UG Final semester Examination including B.Ed. / B.T. need to upload only the Final semester mark-sheet.
 - (d) *Applicants having more than one mark-sheet / grade-sheet in a particular semester (repeaters/betterment) need to upload all the mark-sheet / grade-sheet in a single PDF file.*
 - ii) Relevant document (e.g., 10th standard pass certificate/admit card/birth certificate) for verification of age.

- iii) Relevant certificate(s) from the concerned authority in case of applying for admission under any category of reservation.
- iv) 10th and 12th standard mark-sheets and pass certificates.
- v) In case of B.Ed. and M.Ed. programme applicants deputed by Govt. of Assam must submit study leave certificate / No Objection Certificate from their concerned employers.
- vi) The applicants who passed the qualifying examination earlier than the current year will have to submit a gap certificate from any of the following:
 - a) The Head of the Institution last attended.
 - b) Officer-in-charge of the nearest Police Station.
 - c) Govt. Gazetted Officer testifying his/her activities during the interim period.
 - d) Medical Certificate from the Govt. Medical Officer on genuine medical ground(s).

6. SELECTION AND ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- a) Admission in B.Ed., M.Ed., and all PG, Diploma and Certificate courses will be purely on merit basis.
- b) The entrance test for admission in M.Phil. and PhD programme will be separately notified by the University.
- c) The in-service candidates admitted for M.Phil. / PhD will have to submit *No Objection Certificate* from the Head of the Institution at the time of application. The Departmental Research Committee (DRC) will decide the number of M.Phil. / PhD scholars to be guided by a supervisor in accordance with Bodoland University M.Phil. / PhD regulations.
- d) If a forged document submitted by a candidate is detected even after admission, the admission will stand cancelled.
- e) The Admission Committee has every right to refuse admission if the candidate fails to produce the original documents when asked for.
- f) The decision of the Admission Committee regarding admission is final.

7. CANCELLATION OF SEATS

A student failing to attend classes for seven days at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes shall forfeit his / her seat.

8. ATTENDANCE

75% class attendance is compulsory to appear in all end semester examinations.

9. SUPREME COURT RULES REGARDING ANTI RAGGING

- a. As per the direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the Government has banned ragging completely in any form inside and outside the campus. Accordingly, Bodoland University authority is determined not to allow any form of ragging. Whosoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets, or instigates ragging within or outside the University shall have an FIR lodged against him / her and he / she will be suspended or rusticated from the institution and shall also be liable to be fined which may extend to Rs. 10,000/-. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he/she has indulged in ragging, admission can be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the institution. The punishment may also include suspension from attending the classes, withholding / withdrawing fellowship / scholarship, and other financial benefits or withholding the result.
- b. The candidate as well as his / her parents, during the admission will be required to furnish an undertaking in the form of an affidavit that the candidate will not indulge in any form of ragging.
- c. **Submission of Affidavits on Ragging**
All admitted students will have to submit two duly-filled Affidavits on Ragging to the concerned Head of Department as and when asked for. Students admitted to hostels will have to submit a second set of the two Affidavits to the Warden of the concerned hostel as and when asked for.

10. FEES STRUCTURE FOR PG/DIPLOMA/CERTIFICATE COURSES

The admission is free for this academic session (2020-2021) as all admission fees have been waived as per the notification by Govt. of Assam. However, each admitted student must have to plant a sapling in his / her custody and look after for its survival. Student has to submit a photograph of the same to the University.

Students must perform 92 credits to earn a master degree in Geography. With full-time enrolment, students can become a post-graduate in two years.

FIELDWORK OPPORTUNITIES

In teaching Geography, we emphasize the importance of fieldwork since we believe there is no substitute for teaching subjects first hand. Thus in second-semester students take part in a week-long field course within the country. In the final semester, students are to do independent research in the field and to submit a dissertation for evaluation.

M.Phil. & PhD PROGRAMME

The Department has opened up the opportunity of research by introducing M.Phil. in 2020 and PhD in 2019. With the present faculty position, Geography of Bodoland University has an endeavour to study the multifaceted predicament and concerns related to environment and society faced by the region. Most of us do research that addresses the core concerns of environmental and social issues. We seek to understand inequalities within and across the country and the world, and to understand how the study of the environment and social issues can help to eliminate constraints of resource development and social wellbeing for all protecting our ecosystems.

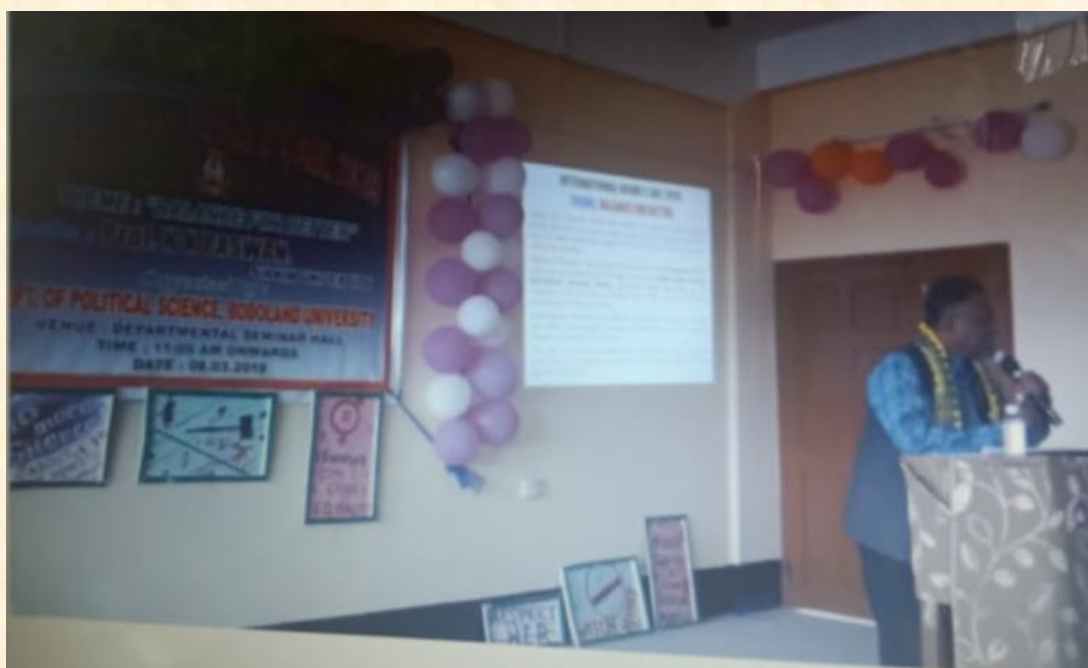

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B.Ed. & M.Ed. PROGRAMME

Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) programme

The B.Ed. programme under Bodoland University started since the academic session 2014-2015. The University provides B.Ed. programme in four District Institutes of Educational Training (DIET) viz., DIET Morigaon, DIET Nalbari, DIET Barpeta-Howly and DIET Bongaigaon. The intake capacity of three DIETs is 50, while DIET Morigaon has 100 seat capacity. 20% seats are reserved for deputation in these DIETs.

Besides, three B.Ed. Colleges affiliated to Bodoland University viz. Government College of Teachers' Education (GCTE), Kokrajhar, Raimale Academy College (B.Ed.) and Gossaigaon B.Ed. College with intake capacity of 100 each. 50% seats are reserved for deputation in GCTE, Kokrajhar, while 20% seats are reserved for deputation in the remaining two other Colleges. 80% seats will be reserved for the students of affiliated colleges of Bodoland University.

A graduate or equivalent from any recognized university with at least 50% mark in aggregate may apply for the programme. However, if a candidate does not have 50% marks in UG course, then the candidate must have 55% in PG course. Relaxation for reserved quota of SC / ST candidates is as per norms (5% of the total marks). Teachers with deputation by the Govt. of Assam have been given special emphasis with atleast 20% seat reservation. The selection of candidate is purely based on merit.

Master of Education (M.Ed.) programme

Government College of Teachers' Education (GCTE) affiliated under Bodoland University has been providing M.Ed. programme since the academic session 2017-2018. The total intake capacity is 50 out of which 20% seats are reserved for deputation. Among the rest 80% seats, 80% seats will be reserved for the students of affiliated colleges of Bodoland University. Any candidate with B.Ed. / B.T. with at least 55% marks in aggregate as per latest NCTE norms from Bodoland University or any other institutes recognised by Bodoland University or other universities may apply for this programme. Relaxation for reserved quota of SC / ST candidates is as per norms (5% of the total marks). The selection of candidate is purely based on merit.

CENTRE FOR BAMBOO STUDIES

Initiated in 2013-14 as Diploma in Bamboo Technology course under the aegis of Department of Biotechnology, Bodoland University was sponsored by the Agriculture Department, Bodoland Territorial Council Secretariat, Bodofa Nwgr, Kokrajhar and National Mission on Bamboo Applications, New Delhi. It was upgraded to the “Centre for Bamboo Studies” in 2017 with its independent identity.

Bamboo is an important natural, renewable livelihood resource in Bodoland Territorial Council which grows in about one third of natural forest as pure and mixed are cultivated on homestead & Non-forest land. Bamboo production in Bodoland Territorial Council area is quite low and there is a need to enhance it through scientific Cultivation of suitable species and improved management of bamboo based Non-forest or forest.

Since, bamboo is the main source of livelihood for rural people of this region. It is therefore the need of the hour to make the people aware of the proper use and scope of Bamboo in Bodoland. The course is very much important for Bodoland Territorial Council because it provides them in-depth knowledge in various aspects of bamboos.

The primary aim of the course is to motivate students for self employment, as well as to carry out extensive research in various aspects of bamboo with particular emphasis in bamboo cultivation and germplasm conservation.

CONTACT DETAILS

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The “CENTRE FOR BODO STUDIES (CBS)” started functioning in 2014 on the basis of Memorandum of Settlement of Bodo Accord, 2003. Bodoland University designed the centre to facilitate scholars, thinkers and interested individuals in augmenting new approach of study on the Bodo Ethnic Group of North East India with reference to national and international viewpoints. The primary concept of the centre is to contribute enormity of Indian diversity in nation building approaches. Bodoland University envisioned building Bodo language and culture and antiquity an entity of the great Indian culture. Now, the centre has become a part of University with substantial autonomy to function and solitary identity as “Centre,” to run by this Regulation. The Centre for Bodo Studies supports three types of scholars to undertake their studies. Firstly, the research scholars who want to undertake their studies on the related premise of Language, Culture and Antiquity of the Bodos can be a registered member scholar of the Centre. Secondly, the writers or thinkers who have no requisite degrees to carryout research work but having good studies and knowledge on the area can also register as member scholar. Thirdly, who are energized to study on various aspects of the Bodos methodically or want to publish their research works in an organized way, they can also become member scholar of the Centre. In all these three categories of scholars and learners the Centre would extend memberships with support of available sources and guidance to find the goal. The centre also organizes seminar, workshop, training on various knowledge and skill of Bodo group and share their research findings with the nation and abroad.

BACKGROUND

The Bodo Accord, signed between Government of India, Government of Assam and under the Bodo leaders, has recommended for the establishment of Centre / Institute for research, development and spreading of Bodo language. It has been mentioned in the Sl. No. 1 of the Annexure-4 of the Bodo Accord, 2003.

Establishment of a Centre for Bodo Studies in the Kokrajhar Campus of Gauhati University is a long cherished desire of the Bodo people, intellectuals, writers, artists, social activists, journalist, social workers and scholars of this region. The project has a special significance after the signing of Bodo Accord which brings these aboriginal people under the sixth schedule of the Indian Constitution for their protection as well as development and the Bodo Language under the Eight scheduled for upholding and promotion of the Bodo language, culture and arts.

In 2000, the Educational Consultant India Limited, a Govt. of India Enterprise, which was deputed by the MHRD, Govt. of India, to study the feasibility of an autonomous University at Kokrajhar has suggested for setting up a Centre for Bodo Studies at University Campus, Kokrajhar with its up gradation to a full-fledged University. The Bodo language, literature, Culture and folklore, despite their richness, remain unexposed due to lack of the patronage of the government for their exploration. The Bodos have a developed literature with eminent play wrights, novelist and short storywriters among them. But, the investigations of Bodo language and literature or methodical research are yet to be done due to the lack of proper facilities and institutional support.

The Bodoland University, which conducts Master Degree course along with research works, cannot cover the entire aspects of the Bodos like history, socio-economy, culture, behavior, language, religion etc. Many of these fields are still virgin and need to be exploited scientifically. So, there was enough potentiality for running a Centre for Bodo Studies at the University level to cater the need of the scholars of different disciplines. The establishment of a Study Centre at Bodoland University is very fruitful as its catchment area cover entire North East India, West Bengal and neighbouring countries like Nepal, Bangladesh, Bhutan, who have close contact with the Bodos since time immemorial and will give scope for studying inter-state culture, language and literature. The growth of Bodo language, literature and culture in tune with the development of the mainstream India will help instill national feeling, moral responsibilities among the Bodos and promote fellow feeling in the region.

VISION

Centre for Bodo Studies (CBS) has envisioned to reconstruct the endangered Bodo culture, language and antiquity which was about to disappear in the midst of globalization process. The Bodo language and culture need to be developed suitably to cope with the other language and culture of the country. India being the multi-cultural and multi-lingual nation offers scope for self development and self identity to all small communities. The mission of the Centre shall be to carry out extensive study in organized ways for creating and enhancing domain of fundamental knowledge with new tools and methods in scientific way through quality study, research, consultancy, learning & teaching, documentation, archiving and digitization, exchanging ideas of culture, language, racial identity and so forth. Centre for Bodo Studies (CBS) is an interdisciplinary concept in its own realm with quest for true knowledge and disseminating to truth. It intends to become a pioneering force in the development of scholastic potential among its ethnic group in the region. It shall have facilities and provision for extension and exchange of knowledge and studies with other likeminded institutions of India and abroad.

Also it aims at developing competency in translation from other language into Bodo & vice versa.

With the alarming growth of the global population proportionate growth of food and nutrition is always a prime concern. The issue becomes even grimmer with the depletion of potent agricultural land and other resources. One more issue which started finding importance among discussion of different fora is the management of solid waste which includes agricultural waste as well. Mushroom cultivation is found to be such as bolete, puffball, stinkhorn, and morel.

The act of consuming mushrooms (mycophagy) dates back to ancient times. Edible mushrooms can appear either below ground (hypogeous) or above ground (epigeous) & edibility may be defined by criteria that include the absence of poisonous effects on humans and desirable taste and aroma. A popular answer to all the above concerns and which stands as a quality food requires less land and can be a tool to manage agricultural waste. Diversification in any farming system imparts sustainability. Mushrooms are one such component that not only imparts diversification but also help in addressing the problems of quality food, health, and environmental sustainability. Consumption of mushroom on a daily basis boosts the health of the consumer.

The attributes are good for heart (no cholesterol), low calorie food (good for diabetic patient), prevents cancer (especially prostate and breast cancer by arresting the action of 5-alpha reductase and aromatase, these enzymes are responsible for growth of cancerous tumor), anti-aging property (the polysaccharide from Mushroom are potent scavenger's of super oxide free radical), regulates digestive system, strengthen immunity. Mushroom like *Trametes versicolor* synthesize Polysaccharide-K (Kresin) which is a leading anti-cancer drug. Mushroom is basically the fruiting body of fungi visible outside and can be seen by naked eye. Biologically Mushroom describes a variety of gilled fungi, with or without stems, and the term is used even more generally, to describe both the fleshy fruiting bodies and leathery fruiting bodies. Morphology deviating from the standard usually has more specific names such as bolete, puffball, stinkhorn and morel.

GENESIS OF THE WORK

Mushroom - a low cost health food, nutraceutical in nature having massive agro waste conversion ability, highest producer of protein per unit area & time, is highly suitable as a tool for developing rural entrepreneurship and sustainable development in mountains. Further, agro climate of Bodoland Territorial Area District (BTAD, 6th Schedule Area) in particular and North Eastern States (Eastern Himalayan States) in general make mushroom cultivation highly suitable and feasible through series of easily understandable entrepreneurship & skill development trainings for the purpose. Further, virtues like minimal resource requirement, very low capital investment, less water requirement, less land requirement and wide availability of organic agro waste and presence of potential domestic and international market make mushroom cultivation venture as a model tool for stand up India & start up India concept. Mycophagy is a common practice in tribal community. Most of the people and rural youth of BTAD are from tribal & other communities and are mostly belong to economically backward families (BPL) who have started emerging as potential Indian youth despite having a recent hard past. Department of Biotechnology, Bodoland University has identified this vital

issue and with the help of DBT-GoI and local BTC Government since 2013, started addressing the local, rural and women entrepreneurs, farmers with alternative and double income through mushroom based tools followed by their value addition and marketing. Initially the venture was confined to BTAD districts of Kokrajhar, Chirang, Baksa, and Udalguri of Assam. Subsequently, it has spread to other districts of Assam and other states like Sikkim, Manipur, Nagaland, Arunachal Pradesh. Initially the work was conducted under DBT-Sponsored Institutional Biotech Hub but subsequently the work is carried out under DBT –sponsored ‘Technology Incubation Centre for entrepreneurship development through mushroom culture & farming’.

PADMASHREE MODARAM BRAHMA CENTRAL LIBRARY

Padmashree Madaram Brahma Central Library (PMBCL) is the liveliest place in the campus providing a safe, comfortable and friendly environment that enables learning and advancement of knowledge, and promotes discovery and scholarship. The mission of the Library is to facilitate creation of new knowledge through acquisition, organization and dissemination of knowledge resources along with providing value added services. The library was established in 2001 in a small room as a part of Gauhati University, Kokrajhar Campus. Library was upgraded in 2009 as full-fledged University library along with the up gradation of Gauhati University, Kokrajhar campus into a full-fledged state University in the name and style of Bodoland University. Since then the library of Bodoland University has been known as Bodoland University Central Library. The library was confined in a single room till 2013 and on 12th August 2013, Library was shifted in multi-storeyed separate building. Despite financial hardship, the library has been trying its best to develop in terms of modern library services so as to provide sufficient knowledge resources to the academic community of the University in the effective way. In 2015, the Central Library was named after a renowned bureaucrat, poet and dramatist Padmashree Madaram Brahma. Since then the Central Library of Bodoland University has been renamed as “Padmashree Madaram Brahma Central Library”.

KOHA has been installed as Integrated Library Management Software (ILMS) for management and organisation of the library systems. At present the barcode based circulation system i.e. issue return of the books is being practiced. At present library holds more than 24000 print books, more than 1600 E-Journals, JSTOR and other resources like M.Phil. & PhD Dissertation, Project work reports etc.

The library has a Digital Library section having 17 dedicated Personal Computers fully with high speed internet connectivity which enables library users to access various subscribed resources and browse in the world of web in search of various resources. With the implementation of Web-OPAC the holdings of the library can be viewed by anybody from anywhere in the world 24×7.

PMBCL BU has been able to successfully implement the Remote Access Platform called Remotexs so as to enabled library users to access subscribed E-Resources from the comfort of their own places wherever they go at any time i.e. 24×7. PMBCL has also successfully implemented its own digital repository in the name and style of Bodoland University Digital Library using DSpace software. This library will play vital role in building institutional repository of various resources of the University like Old Question papers, Thesis & Dissertations, Annual Reports, policy documents, etc. in electronic format which will be accessible by anybody at anytime from anywhere in the world.

A dedicated and independent dynamic website has been designed and launched to provide single stop access to all above portals/platforms. Library is also involved in conducting various programmes like user awareness, workshops, seminars, conferences, book exhibitions, career awareness, etc. with an aim to contribute in the academic activities and general activities of the University.

I. ESTABLISHING THE CENTRAL LIBRARY

The first step towards establishing the library was taken in 2009 with a single room in the old administrative building. The Library worked without library staff member/s for about 4 years. The formal functioning of the Library started in May 2013 with joining of one library professional and one Library Assistant. In the month of August, 2013 the Central Library was shifted to its present location with the floor space of about 9254 sq. ft.

Library has implemented Library management System Software SOUL2.0 with barcode based circulation system, the issue/return of the books by the students is now being converted into automated system. Academic community of the University is provided with necessary reference/information service based on their specific need. In addition, Library extends reference and internet services to the local academic, as well as, civil society members.

University is already connected with DeLnet through which the academic community of the University can access online resources extended by these consortia. Internet facility is also provided in the library through 1gbps NKN line. In addition to the online resources available through these consortia, University has also taken initiative to procure/subscribed selective new resources in 2017. Users are allowed to selectively photocopy the required books/journals articles, etc. through an out-sourced photocopy centre housed outside the Central Library.

II. LIBRARY INFRASTRUCTURE AND FACILITIES

The present floor area of the Central Library is about 9254 sq. ft. Within this space we are providing following facilities-

- a) **Reading room:** Presently 4 computer terminals have been kept for the users along with 100 setting capacity.
- b) **Periodical section:** Several academic journals and periodicals and magazines are displayed for reading purposes and 2 magazine shelves are kept for that purpose.
- c) **Reference section:** The Reference collection of the Central Library is presently displayed in 19 book-shelves.
- d) **Internet facilities:** Library provides free internet facilities to its user through 15 computer terminals connected with 1gbps leased line for access to the e-resources. The entire building is presently Wi-Fi connected and users are also allowed to access the internet facilities through their own laptop.
- e) **Surveillance system:** Most of the passage areas are presently covered by CCTV to secure the Library resources. Security personnel are deployed during the entire functioning hours of the Library.
- f) **Library furniture and equipments:** Over the period the Library was in position to procure several furniture and equipments to facilitate its users' community.

Skill Development, Personality Development and Leadership training for five days was held from 3rd to 7th July, 2017 for different colleges of Kokrajhar District and Skill Development, Personality Development and Leadership training for five days from 5th to 9th January, 2018 was held for all affiliated colleges of BTAD. Adoption of villages, Swacchh Bharat Abhiyan, Digital India Programme, and Plantation are some of the regular voluntary services of NSS undertaken from time to time. Sri Hemanta Boro of M.Com fourth semester, Bodoland University has participated in Republic Day Parade at New Delhi on 26th January, 2019.

The activities carried out by the University NSS Cell are the following:

1. Soon after the establishment of NSS in Bodoland University, the University Cell got an opportunity to organize PRE-REPUBLIC DAY PARADE CAMP-2015 from 07-16th November, 2015, where more than 210 NSS Volunteers including Programme Officers had participated.
2. Every year the Bodoland University, NSS Cell observes the NSS Day by taking different activities in the campus as well as outside the campus. Plantation Programme, Essay Writing Competition on "Hand Washing and Disease Prevention, Seminar on – "Hand Washing and Disease prevention", Cleanliness, Sanitation and Hand Wash- Knowing the Known", Rally, Demonstration at Alaijhoron Orphan Home and sweet distribution to orphans, Cultural programme and many other activities are undertaken every year.
3. National Service Scheme, Bodoland University Cell has various Village Level Awareness campaign. The lecture programme on awareness of Health, Sanitation, Human Rights, Education, and Drug Abuse & Intoxication is undertaken in the programme.
4. Every year, the university cell organizes the 'Life Skill, Leadership, Personality Development Programme' for NSS volunteers, the latest was the special camp on ENRICHMENT and CONSERVATION held on 21st -27th January, 2020.
5. Every year, 'SWACHHTA PAKHWADA' activities are undertaken in university, the latest activity was undertaken on 1st Aug- 15th Aug, 2019 and prior to that 1st Aug- 15th Aug, 2018 and so on. The activity like- seminar, cleaning of statues, schools, colleges, hospitals/PHC's, University campus, rallies and installation of dustbins etc. are conducted from time to time
6. Every year the World Environment Day, International Day of Yoga, Rashtriya Ekta Diwas are celebrated with NSS volunteers of the university. Further the NSS regular activities are also undertaken in the university.
7. Time to time NSS Programme Officers has participated in various NSS orientation programme, training for trainers on Youth & Sustainable Development Goals, and Life Skills training etc.
8. The NSS volunteers have participated in various programmes like- North East NSS Festival, National Integration Camp, National Youth Festival, PRD camp etc. Two of the NSS volunteers of the University recently participated in Pre- Republic Day Parade

Camp-2020 held in Durgapur. NSS volunteers had also participate in the National Integration Camp organized by Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, NSS Regional Director, New Delhi held at Jammu University (J & K) from 22nd February to 28th February, 2020 and was the 2nd best team among all the participants.

9. The NSS Cell of Bodoland University has taken a long stride in building characters of the students of the university and colleges and people as a whole to make the nation a developed one.

(B) Restricted Holidays: Each Employee is permitted to avail 2 (two) more holidays in the year to be chosen by him/her from the restricted holiday's list mentioned below. The employees intending to avail this holiday should submit application to the concerned head for approval of the competent authority in advance. Such leave will normally be granted by the leave sanctioning authority except when the presence of the employee(s) is considered necessary due to exigencies of work in the University.
