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UNIVERSITY PROFILE

Chaudhary Ranbir Singh University was established by the State Legislature Act 28 of 2014 on July 24, 2014, with a sprawling campus of 75 acres situated on 5th milestone on Rohtak by pass, Jind. The University was established with the vision of imparting quality education by creating most conducive ambience for the production and dissemination of knowledge guided by innovative thinking, scientific enquiry, sublime human values, sustainable ecology, and democratic ethos. The aim of the University is the cultivation of citizens with a rich awareness of our heritage to lead and serve in every sphere of human activity. Working under the leadership of eminent educationists and social reformers, Hon'ble Chancellor Shri Satyadeo Narain Arya and dedicated, dynamic and devoted personality Vice- Chancellor Prof. R.B. Solanki, the University is heading towards realization of its vision and the goal of being in the ranking by 2021.

The University is recognized u/s 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956 vide letter no. 9-12/2014 (CPP-I/PU) Dated September 26, 2014 and is also a member of the Association of Indian Universities. The University is also recognized by the University Grants Commission, New Delhi under section 12-B of the UGC Act 1956 vide letter no. F.No.9-12/2014 (CPP-I/PU) Dated January 03, 2018 to be eligible for central assistance. In a short span of five years, the university has many achievements to its credit. In addition to the academics, the students are also encouraged to participate in sports events and extracurricular activities at the campus as well as outside the campus for their wholesome personality development.

The university has launched the syllabi of Universal Human Values (UHV) to be implemented in every department from the semester beginning 2019. The goal of this program is to bring qualitative (spiritual) transformation in the personality of learners. It intends to impact their physical, mental, and spiritual self, enabling them to develop a caring attitude for others.

The university organized 2nd convocation on July 22, 2019 to award degrees to the pass out students of Ph.D, M. Phil, Post Graduate and Graduate programme in 2017 and 2018. Hon'ble Governor Sh. Satyadeo Narain Arya was the Chief Guest on the day. In the convocation two Ph.D students, 21 M.Phil Students, 878 Post Graduate students and 82 Graduate students were awarded degrees. Social thinker Shri Indresh Ji was awarded Honorary Doctorate Degree.

In addition to the academics, the students are also encouraged to participate in sports events and extracurricular activities at the campus as well as outside the campus for enable their wholesome

personality development. The university has a newly constructed academic block with latest infrastructure and newly constructed Laxmi Bai Girls Hostel & Boys Hostel with ultra-modern facilities. The university has an impressive Language Labs which is open for all the students of the university to help them to improve their communication skills. The university also has a Computer lab well equipped with the latest software and is networked with 32 mbps internet speed with fiber optical device. The University has recently established Lab for Physics and Chemistry department with the state of art facilities and latest equipments'. These labs will increase the practical knowledge of M.Sc. students. Keeping in the view syllabus requirements of M.Sc. and to enhance the student's interest in research, CRSU is in process of establishment of research lab.

The Psychology lab of the university is spacious and fully equipped with latest equipment to carry out the tests. The Conference room of the university is equipped with world class facilities with a seating capacity of 40 persons. The University also has a centrally air-conditioned Auditorium Hall with all modern audio visual facilities with a sitting capacity of 240 persons. The construction for the extension of academic block, Second Computer Lab, Administrative Block, Boys Hostel, Sports Stadium and residential quarters for faculty is in full swing. The students of this university have shown commendable results in academics as well as co-curricular activities. With the present pace of progress, the university looks forward to having a promising future.

ACHIEVEMENTS OF UNIVERSITY

- Two students from India who are from Chaudhary Ranbir Singh University Jind namely Mr. Vijender Mudgil and Mr. Ravinder participated with a project in "Entrepreneurship Development Programme" organized by HEBUT, China from July 1-21, 2019 and won first prize from 60 participants of 10 countries.
- 44 students of various teaching Departments of Chaudhary Ranbir Singh University, Jind qualified JRF/NET in 2019.
- The students of M.Sc. in the Department of Physics of this University got published two research paper in 'Journal of Non-Crystalline Solids' with an impact factor of 2.6.
- Training and Placement Cell of the University organized Campus Pool in the University Campus on 27th April, 2019 in which 15 companies participated, 473 students of different branches / courses were registered and 125 students were placed in different companies.

- Two girl students of University participated in South Asian Federation Game in 2016 and received highest sport “**Bhim Award**”.

UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

Libraries are an integral part of almost all educational institutes in India. CRSU, Library is a Central facility, which caters to the informational requirements of the students, teachers, research scholars, and other staff of the University. University Library is well equipped with nearly 17851 books along with the subscription of reputed e-resources. The University Library has subscribed 22 newspapers & 6 Employment News in Hindi & English Languages. It is well equipped with the technology and infrastructure. It has five computers for the use of the Researchers, Students and Teachers. Kiosk system has also been installed for the convenience of the Library Users. The Library, at present not only allows the members to borrow books or other resources, but also provides reading rooms where the readers can study peacefully. The Library timings are from 9:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M (Issue/Return-9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.). The University Library recorded about 200 users including students and staff of the University. University Library has air conditioner reading environment. Library have the subscription of online e-resources like, Turnitin Software (Plagiarism Checker), DELNET Database, Prowess IQ ACM Digital Library, Emerald 138 ESS Journals, Sage Publications (31 Journals), South Asian Archive, World E-Book Library.

LAXMI BAI GIRLS' HOSTEL

The University has one Girls hostel named after the Queen of Jhansi, Rani Laxmi Bai. It has the capacity of accommodating 240 girls. The hostel is provided with electronic gadgets including electric geysers, 32” Plasma TVs along with Dish/DTH facility and water cooler with RO system. The hostels subscribe to several national and regional dailies and magazines for enabling the students to know what is happening around the world. Sport facilities for girls include table tennis and badminton court, volleyball court, gym and different indoor games like carom-board and chess etc. Medical facilities to all hostel residents are provided through the University Health Centre located in the Utility Centre. The University also has a Horticulture Club maintained by the girls of the Hostel. Beauty and skin care clinic have been established for the grooming of the students. The hostel on the campus operates its own mess providing hygienic and nutritious meals with a varied menu. In view of the large number of students applying for hostel accommodation, the university allows hostel to the students on the basis of their merit in the admission list.

CHHATRAPATI SHIVAJI CHHATRAWAS FOR BOYS

The University has one boy's hostel after the name of great Indian Freedom Fighter, Chhatrapati Shivaji. It has capacity to accommodate 200 Students. The hostel has following facilities:

- Reading Hall Fully Air Conditioned.
- 125 KV Generators for 24 Hrs. Power Supply.
- Water Cooler along with RO Purifier.
- Electric Water Geyser
- Recreational Room equipped with 42 Inch Plasma TV alongwith D2H Connection.
- Subscription of Several National on Regional dailies and magazines.
- Sports facility includes Table Tennis, Badminton Court and other indoor game like Carom Board and Chess etc.
- State of Arts Dinning Facility.
- CCTV Surveillance.
- Well furnished guest rooms for parents and visitors

The Hostel on the Campus operates its own mess providing hygienic and nutritious meals with a varied menu. In of the large number of students applying for hostel accommodation, the University allows hostel to the students on the basis of their merit in the admission.

UNIVERSITY HEALTH CENTRE

The Health Centre located in University Campus has sufficient space for a dispensary with patient Beds and stools with drop stand. The centre has a visiting doctor and a nurse and provides medical consultation and free medicines to all students and staff. The health centre is well equipped with all basic apparatus and general medicines. The Health Centre also provides first line of treatment in emergency cases. The process for the full-fledged development of university health centre is in process and will be accomplished soon.

UNIVERSITY COMPUTER AND INFORMATICS CENTRE (UCIC)

The University Computer & Informatics Centre (UCIC) is striving to develop the University as "Digital University" and working rigorously to provide the excellent infrastructure facilities with High end systems controlled by Dell Make power Server. Central UPS with a power back up of 8 hours is controlling all the Computer Systems connected via optical fiber LAN covering the whole Campus. 24*7 Internet facility with **500 Mbps** is available for students as well as staff members. UCIC is continuously monitoring and updating all the information on university

website. The UCIC established a Computer Centre with the objective of providing readily available facilities of computers to the students and teaching and non-teaching staff of the University. It also purports to automate administrative and secretarial wings of the University with the aim to cater to the needs of the entire University. University Computer & Informatics Centre (UCIC) is providing opportunity to enhance Professional Knowledge among students and staff members. One Language lab established to improve communication skills of the student in order to compete in the era of Globalization. The University Computer & Informatics Centre (UCIC) manages the services of Video Conferencing, IPABX Telephone exchange, Centralized File Management Systems (CFMS) etc for facilitation of students & staff members.

LANGUAGE LAB

The Language lab has been established to improve communication skills of the students. The Lab is equipped with latest software related to English Language and Communication. It provides a host of opportunities for students to work with online exercise sheets and virtual practice sessions, thus enabling them to learn language in a simulated environment.

PANDIT DEEN DAYAL UPADHAYAYA CENTRE (PDDUC)

The Realizing the increasing gap between the Education and one of its ultimate aim of constructively using it for earning a livelihood, PDDUC was established in the campus of the University.

The main objectives of the centre, as stated and defined by the university, are mentioned below:

- Human Transformation.
- To encourage the students to be entrepreneurs and be job givers rather than remain seekers
- To encourage cooperative culture amongst the students and make them good citizens of the country.

The mandate and mission statement was Human Transformation & Entrepreneurship via Capability Enabling and Youth Empowerment. Career coaching by trained faculty was arranged from Delhi since not available locally in addition to inviting domain experts to encourage the student community to prepare for exams conducted at the centre and state level under respective Subordinate Selection Commissions. Domain experts in personality Development and communication skills were again hired from outside (since not available locally)

SC/ST/OBC CELL

The SC/ST/OBC Cell has been established for the welfare of SC/ST/OBC students of the University and affiliated Colleges as per the instructions of the UGC/State Government. The Cell also functions as a Grievances Redressal Cell for the grievances of the SC/ST/OBC students and employees of the University and affiliated Colleges to provide them necessary help in solving their academic as well as administrative problems. The Cell also performed other works assigned from time to time to promote higher education among the communities suffering from economic, social and educational deprivations. To aware the students about various schemes, scholarship and various facilities provide by Central and State Government. The main objective of the SC/ST/OBC Cell is to ensure proper implementation of various schemes of University Grants Commission/Government of India/State Government introduced from time to time.

GUIDANCE AND COUNSELLING CELL

Different programs are being organized under guidance and counseling cell of the University. A one day “*Sakshakta Se Sarthakta ke Or*” program was organized on February 9th, 2019 in Laxmi Bai Hostel for students of the university campus. Total 125 students attended the program. The goal of the program was to make students aware of the demands of present work environment, discovering their own self and its empowerment and how to develop themselves as entrepreneurs. This program was organized by collective efforts of Director of Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhaya Center- Col. Mehar Singh Dahiya and Convener of Guidance & Counseling Cell- Dr. Alka Seth.

TRAINING & PLACEMENT CELL

Training and Placement Cell will invite and host companies on campus to hold recruitments for our students and despite the job market looking bleak this time round consists of students from different courses in their final year. The aim is to invite companies from various fields in order to make opportunities available not just for students of business but also for the students of science and arts.

Training and Placement Cell will also organize workshops and job for them. In addition, Training and Placement Cell will also organize different activities to enhance the skills of the students like:

- Soft Skills Development
- Career Building

- Mock Group Discussions
- Mock Interviews

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL

The university has constituted Equal opportunity cell to provide equal opportunity to all including the persons with disability. In addition, it will also examine all the possible ways in which SC/ST, OBC and all other minority groups could be helped.

VIGILANCE CELL

The university has constituted Vigilance cell to activate vigilance machinery for investigating complaints and sensitizing the university community against corruption and corrupt practices. The main objective of this cell is to prevent the possibilities of corruption and to encourage a culture of honesty and integrity.

RESEARCH CELL

The university has constituted the Research Cell to facilitate and promote quality research in emerging areas of higher education with focus on new frontiers and to act as a knowledge power- house capable of contributing to the national development and welfare of the society.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

IQAC plays an important role in improving the quality of higher education in University system. Considering the same and with the spirit to enhance the quality in education, IQAC cell was established in the year 2014. Since its establishment, IQAC is working hard and making best possible efforts to achieve the goal. As this cell is related for quality, hence various sub committees have been constituted to complete the work in time bound manner with promising efficiency. Number of workshops have been done and planned in near future. Sufficient emphasis is being tried to give for research also, which is one of the crucial factors in achieving good score in NAAC.

INTERNAL COMPLAINT COMMITTEE (ICC)

The University is committed to provide to all women a place of work and study free of sexual harassment, intimidation and exploitation. It is expected that all students, faculty, staff, karamcharis and officials treat one another and visitors to the University with respect. Reports of sexual behavior are taken seriously and dealt with promptly.

Sexual harassment can take place in various forms; some subtle and indirect, some blatant and overt. For instance any one or more of the following acts of unwelcome behavior (directly or

by implication); physical contact and advances, A demand or request for sexual favors, Making sexually colored remarks, Showing pornography, any other unwelcome physical, verbal or nonverbal conduct of sexual nature.

As per policy the University constitutes ICC every year representing different stakeholders. Students can take help of ICC without any hesitation. Complaints can be made directly to any member of ICC or through existing channels of lodging grievances.

SPORTS ACTIVITIES

These all activities Sports activities of the university are being run under the Chaudhary Ranbir Singh University Sports Council (CRSUSC). The university has the following playfields: Handball (two), Football, Volleyball, Netball, Korfbal, Kho-Kho (two), Kabaddi , Basketball, Tennis, Table Tennis, Cricket ground, Shooting Range, GYM and Athletic Track 400 meters. The university is going to have its International level Sports Stadium soon. The university provides different sports facilities to its players taking part in the inter university tournaments like free TA & DA, sport kit and track suit, free medical facility and cash award to the players winning positions in these tournaments.

- CRS University 18 male/female players participate in Khelo India University games 2020.

- A University team consisting of 32 candidates participated in North Zone/All India Inter University Tournament 2019-20.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

National Service Scheme (NSS) promotes the spirit of voluntary work among the students and teachers through sustained community interactions. It brings academic institutions near to the society. It shows how to combine knowledge and action to achieve results, which are desirable for community development. NSS at Chaudhary Ranbir Singh University was established with the objective of providing the youth an opportunity to develop their overall personality by taking part in various Social Service Schemes. The University has initiated the process of students' enrolment. Students will be given opportunity to participate in state and national level camps. Merit certificates are provided to students, who perform well in the camps. The NSS unit organized special camp on digital financial literacy and four students also received appreciation from MHRD, Government of India. 10. The candidates appearing in the PET must wear proper sports kit, otherwise he/she will not be allowed for the test.
11. The result of PET will be declared on the spot.

RULES / PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION TO WARD OF KASHMIRI MIGRANTS

These rules are applicable to the students desirous for admission to various programmes run by this University under Kashmiri Migrants Students.

1. Only those Kashmiri Migrants who have migration certificate and have passed their qualifying examination on the last date of submission of admission form are eligible.
2. Academic Qualifications for admission to various programmes run by this University shall be the same as mentioned in the section-I “Eligibility for Admissions”. Further, a relaxation in cut-off percentage up to 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirement may be allowed by the Vice- Chancellor as per letter F.No. 3-4/2017-NER, Govt. of India dated 15.10.2019 of Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Higher Education, Economic Administration Division, New Delhi.
3. One seat in each programme is reserved for Kashmiri Migrants & this seat is to be filled up on supernumerary basis on the inter-se-merit of Kashmiri Migrants on the basis of percentage of qualifying examination. In case of tie-up score, the criteria lay down by the Haryana State Technical Education Society, Panchkula/ University Prospectus 2020-21 for Postgraduate programmes will be followed, if two candidates secure the same marks in the qualifying examinations.
4. The candidates applying under Kashmiri Migrants (K.M.) will produce a certificate in the support of their claim from the competent authority or Relief Commissioner.
5. Mere possession of the prescribed academic qualifications does not entitle a candidate for admission to these programmes. Candidates are required to fulfill other conditions as spelt out in the University Prospectus.
6. If a candidate simultaneously applies for more than one options i.e. through Entrance Test & under Kashmiri Migrants (KM) Quota, he/she is required to apply separately.
7. The domicile certificate is not required in case of Kashmiri Migrants.

SECTION-II RESERVATION OF SEATS AND GUIDELINES FOR RESERVATION

A. Distribution of seats

The seats shall be distributed as under:

1. All India Category including Haryana : 15%
2. Bonafide Residents of Haryana : 85% *

*(60% of the seats earmarked for bonafide residents of Haryana will be reserved for the categories as mentioned at (B) below, as per State Govt. policy and remaining 40% seats will be filled from among Haryana General Category)

B. Reservation of seats for Bonafide Residents of Haryana

The seats shall be reserved for the categories as under:

(i)	Scheduled Castes	20%
(ii)	Backward Classes of Haryana (except Socially Advanced Persons/Sections (Creamy Layer)	27% (16 % for Block-A) (11 % for Block-B)
(iii)	Economically Weaker Sections (who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservation for the Scheduled Castes, Backward Class (Block-A &B) other than category (i) & (ii) above.	10%
(iv)	Differently Abled	03% if the seats reserved for differently abled persons remain vacant due to non-availability of suitable differently abled candidates, it may be offered to Ex-servicemen and their wards (1%) and dependents of Freedom Fighters (1%).

(v)	<p>Further 3% horizontal reservation is also provided to Ex-servicemen/Freedom Fighters and their dependents by providing reservation within reservation of 1% of General category, 1% out of Scheduled Castes and 1% from Backward Classes category for admissions to the various educational institutions of the Govt. and Govt. aided/ institutes located in Haryana. As far as block allocation in Block A and Block B of Backward Classes category is concerned, year wise rotational system will be adopted. For example, if Block A of Backward Classes are given seats in the Academic Year 2019, the next Block i.e. B Block of category of Backward Classes will be given seats in the next academic year i.e. 2020 and so on. The concerned Chairperson/Director of the Department/Institute shall maintain a roster register for horizontal reservation of Ex-servicemen/Freedom Fighter & their dependents and carry forward all fractions till one seat is accumulated through different fractions over the year. As and when the total comes to one, a seat will be provided to the concerned category.</p>
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Guidelines for Reservation:

- 1. The reservation of seats is as per the Reservation Policy of Haryana Govt. and is subject to any change/amendment made by the State Govt. from time to time.**
- 2. Candidates belonging to SC/ST are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per **Annexure-II**. The list of Scheduled Castes notified by the Haryana Government is available at **Appendix-B**.**
- 3. Candidates belonging to Backward Classes are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per **Annexure-III**. The list of Backward Classes in Haryana notified by the Haryana Government, is available at **Appendix-B**. Circular no. 1170-SW(1)-95 dated 7.6.95, No. 22/36/2000-3GS-III dated 09.08.2000 & No. 213-SW(1)-2010 dated 31.08.2010 of the Haryana Govt. for excluding Socially Advanced Persons/Sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes may be referred to **Annexure-III**.**
- 4. The Children or Grand Children (Maternal & Paternal) of Freedom Fighters are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per **Annexure-VII**.**
- 5. Only those candidates who have permanent disability of not less than 40% (being otherwise fit for admission to the course) will be considered for admission as Differently Abled. They will submit a certificate from the competent authority as per **Annexure-V**. Disability Certificate shall, however, be subject to verification by a Medical Board to be constituted by the University. The decision of Medical Board in this regard shall be final.**

6. Children or Wards of Military Personnel (including personnel of Para-Military Forces killed in Action or Permanently Disabled in Action and Boarded Out from the Services or Ex-Servicemen and their wards will be considered for reservation. They will submit a certificate as per **Annexure-VIII**. The following categories of personnel of Territorial Army are included in the definition of Ex-Servicemen in terms of the State Govt. letter No. 12/18/2006-GS-II dated 8-01-2008:

- i. Pension holders for continuous embodied service;
- ii. Persons with disability attributable to military service;
- iii. Gallantry Award Winners; and
- iv. Such recruits boarded out/released on medical grounds and granted medical/disability pension.

7. A candidate who applies for a reserved category or for both reserved and general categories will be considered first in general category. In case, he is not selected in general category, he will be considered for reserve category.

The Scheduled Castes/Backward Classes candidates who get selected /admitted in Educational/Professional/Technical Institutions and Universities in open competition on the basis of their own merit, will not be counted against the quota reserved for scheduled caste/ backward classes, rather they will be treated as open competition candidates. However, such candidates shall fulfill condition of eligibility regarding age etc. as are meant for general category candidates (Memo No.13864-75 dated 24.8.2012 received from the Principal Secretary to Govt. of Haryana, Welfare of Scheduled Caste and Backward Classes, Department, Chandigarh).

8. If a candidate belongs to more than one reserved category, he/she shall be required to give his/her preference at the time of filling up the admission form. Preference once given shall not be changed.
9. If any seat remains vacant in sub-categories of BC(A) and BC(B), the same will be filled up through the candidates belonging to other category. For example, if any seat in BC(B) category remains vacant, the same will be filled up from BC(A) category and vice-versa.
10. Final Counseling based on physical presence will be done by the concerned department at their own level. At the time of final counseling, all the vacant seats of reserved categories **except SC category seats** will be converted into General Category, in case,

no candidate of respective reserve category is available and the same will be filled up on merit basis. Seats of SC category will not be filled up from another category.

11. As per instructions of the Government of Haryana, General Administration Department, General Services-III Branch, Chandigarh containing in letter No. 22/10/2013-1GSIII dated 10.08.2017 for giving following priorities for reservations or preferences to the wards of Armed Forces personnel for admission in medical/professional/non-professional courses running in the University Teaching Departments/Institutes/Affiliated/Maintained Colleges/ Institutes :

- a) Priority-I : Widows/Wards of Defense personnel killed in action.
- b) Priority-II : Wards of disabled in action and boarded out from service.
- c) Priority-III : Widows / Wards of Defense personnel who died while in service with death attributable to military service.
- d) Priority-IV : Wards of disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military service.
- e) Priority-V : Wards of Ex-servicemen who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards:
 - (i) Param Vir Chakra
 - (ii) Ashok Chakra
 - (iii) Sarvottam Yudh Seva Medal
 - (iv) Maha Vir Chakra
 - (v) Kirti Chakra
 - (vi) Uttam Yudh Seva Medal
 - (vii) Vir Chakra
 - (viii) Shaurya Chakra
 - (ix) Yudh Seva Medal
 - (x) Sena, Nau Sena, Vayu Sena Medal
 - (xi) Mention - in-Despatches
- f) Priority-VI : Wards of Ex-servicemen.

12. **Admission Criteria for EWSs derived from the Government of Haryana, Notification No. 22/12/2019-1GS-III dated 25.02.2019 and even No. dated 13.03.2019 as under :**

a) Income & Assets Certificate issuing Authority:

- i. The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority. The Competent Authority for EWS Income and Asset Certificate shall be Tehsildar of the area where the applicant normally resides.
- ii. As per instructions given in Govt. of Haryana General Administration Dept. (G-III Branch) Notification No.22/12/2019-1GS-III dated

13.03.2019, Verifying Authorities for issue of EWS Certificate shall be same as prescribed for issue of resident/income certificates as specified in instruction No. 22/28/2003-3GS-III, dated 30.01.2004.

- iii. The prescribed format for EWS Income and Asset Certificate shall be provided at **Annexure-IX**.

b) Criteria of Income & Assets :

- i. Persons who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservation for Scheduled Caste, Backward Classes (Block-A) and Backward Classes (Block-B) and whose family has gross annual income below Rs.6.00 lakh (Rupees six lakh only) are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation, Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application.
- ii. Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income:-
 - a) 5 acres of agricultural land and above;
 - b) Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
 - c) Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
 - d) Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities;
 - e) Total immovable assets owned are valued at Rs. One Crore of more.
- iii. The property held by a “Family” in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.
- iv. The term “Family” for this purpose will include the person who applies for benefit of reservation, his/her parents, spouse as well as children and siblings below the age of 18 years.

Note : For any other clarification, Government of Haryana, Notification No. 22/12/2019-1GS-III dated 25.02.2019 and even No. dated 13.03.2019 will be referred.

13. 30% seats in B.P.Ed. will be reserved for female candidates in all categories, as mentioned in Section-I.

14. Differently abled candidates will not be considered for admission to B.P.Ed course

SECTION-III
IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR CANDIDATES

1. Before filling the Admission Form the candidates are required to read the Prospectus carefully.
2. No column should be left blank in Admission Form; write N.A. against the column which is not applicable otherwise it will be considered as incomplete and liable to be rejected.
3. The admissions shall be made on the basis of merit of qualifying examination plus weightage as per Rules for the respective course.
4. Candidates having compartment in the qualifying examination shall not be allowed admission in the course.
5. If the last date of receipt of Application Form and last date for depositing the dues falls on a holiday or that day is declared holiday by the University, the next working day will be considered the last day for the purpose.
6. Each admitted student shall have to furnish Self Declaration by him/her and his/her Parent/Guardian as per specimen given at **ANNEXURE-X & XI** that he/she was never found guilty of ragging and shall not indulge in any act of ragging. At the time of admission every candidate shall be required to give an undertaking of good conduct & behavior and not to indulge in ragging. If a candidate after his/her admission is found indulging in any kind of ragging, his/her admission is liable to be cancelled.
7. No migration or transfer will be allowed from a College to University Department and vice- versa.
8. If a student fails to attend his/her classes continuously for seven teaching days, his/her name shall be struck off from the rolls. He may get readmission with the permission of the Chairperson within 7 days of striking off the name with a readmission fee of Rs. 1000/-. The student may be readmitted twice in an academic year.
9. If a student remains absent from the class or from sports activity (for Physical Education Department for 14 days or more in a month his name will be struck off from the rolls and his/her parents will also be informed.
10. Due to paucity of hostel accommodation, the University may not be in a position to accommodate all the aspirants in the hostels.

11. Candidates seeking admission in educational institutions located in Haryana may not be required to produce Resident Certificate, if they have passed the examination from a school/college situated in Haryana. For this purpose, a certificate of the Principal/Headmaster from concerned institution where the children/wards studied last should be considered sufficient. The Principal/Headmaster of the institution shall be competent to issue such certificate, which should be sufficient.
12. Merit list will be displayed on the Notice Board of the Department concerned and University website. It shall be the sole responsibility of the candidates to remain in touch with the Department concerned for keeping track of progress of admissions and should visit the university website www.crsu.ac.in on regular basis. No separate communication in this regard will be sent to the candidates by the University.
13. **The Vice Chancellor has approved two additional seats for the outstanding sports person in all the courses over & above the sanctioned seats (University act 28 of 2014).**
14. **The Vice Chancellor has approved one seat in all the UTD's (except NCTE approved courses) in addition to approved annual intake for single girl child.**
15. Use of Alcohol and Drugs is prohibited in the University Campus. Every student must observe discipline on the Campus failing which strict action will be taken against him/her.
16. Students of the University promoted in odd semester are required to qualify 50% of the papers in the examinations of both semesters of previous year.
17. A student should always wear his/her ID card in the campus and must be displayed. The same should be shown when demanded by the University officials.
18. If the concerned authorities are not satisfied with the character/past behavior/antecedents of a candidate, they may refuse to admit him/her to any course of study in the University/College in order to ensure academic standards, discipline and peaceful atmosphere in the university. The Vice-Chancellor may cancel the admission of any student for a specified period. (If the Hostel authorities are not satisfied with the character/past behavior/antecedents of a student, Hostel accommodation may be refused to him/her in order to ensure discipline and peaceful atmosphere of the Hostels).

19. In case any candidate is found to have supplied false information, certificates, documents etc. or is found to have withheld or concealed some information in his/her Application Form, he/she shall be liable to be debarred from admission to the course.
20. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of the information submitted by him/her, which is found to be incorrect or false at a later stage, his/her admission will be cancelled and all fees and other dues paid by him/her shall be forfeited. The University/Institute may also take further action, as deemed fit, against the candidate and his/her guardian.
21. Haryana residents are also entitled for admission against All India Category Seats.
22. Nothing contained in this Prospectus should be construed to convey sanction or cited as an authority for which University regulations are applicable. If the concerned authorities are not satisfied with the character, past behavior and antecedents of a candidate, they may refuse to admit him/ her to any course of study in the University in order to ensure academic standards, discipline and peaceful atmosphere in the university. The Vice-Chancellor may cancel the admission of any student for a specified period.
23. As per the Haryana Govt. Welfare of SC and BC Dept. Notification No. 808-SW (1) dated 17.08.2016, in exercise of the powers conferred by Clause (d) of Section 2 of the Haryana Backward Classes (Reservation in Services and Admission in Educational Institutions) Act, 2016 (15 of 2016), the Governor of Haryana specify the following criteria for exclusion of creamy layer within the Backward Classes as per the Schedules appended to the Act namely Schedule-I, II, III:
24. The children of persons having gross income of upto 03 (Three) Lakh Rupees shall first of all get the benefit of reservation in admission. The left out quota shall go to that class of Backward Classes citizens **who earn more than Three Lakh Rupees but upto Six Lakh Rupees per annum** shall be considered as Creamy Layer under section 5 of the Haryana Backward Classes (Reservation in Services and Admission in Educational Institutions) Act, 2016.
25. As per directions of the Director, Higher Education, Haryana, Panchkula vide their letter No. 18/30-2015 UNP(4) dated 08.03.2017 link AADHAR ID with the bank account is mandatory for all the students to be admitted in the University Teaching Departments. Every student shall be in possession of AADHAR Number at the time of admission. All the Chairpersons/Directors of University Teaching Departments will ensure the implementation of the above instructions of the State Government.

26. **State-wise List of Fake Universities and Examinations of Board not recognized for the purpose of higher studies** : List of Fake Universities declared by UGC at **Appendix-C** and Examinations of Board not recognized for the purpose of higher studies by the Board of School Education, Haryana, Bhiwani is available on their websites. Before finalizing the admissions the updated list of recognized examinations of the UGC and the Board of School Education, Haryana, Bhiwani is required to be consulted www.ugc.ac.in/page/Fake-Universities.aspx and www.bseh.org.in
27. As per instructions issued by the the Principal Secretary, Govt. of Haryana, Higher Education Department, Chandigarh letter No.18/172-2016 UNP (4) dated 30.06.2017, the Committee in its meeting held on 02.08.2017 has resolved that maternity leave upto 45 days will be granted to such women students who are studying in the University Teaching Departments in all the courses **except M.P.Ed., B.P.Ed., PG Diploma in Yoga and M.A. (Yoga) to complete their education without any gap/hindrance.**
28. The maternity leave to **women students will be granted by the competent authority with the condition that if the women students avail the maternity leave upto 45 days on recommendation of Govt. Hospital Authorities as applicable as per prescribed rules in the case of Govt. Women Employees,** then the women students will have to attend the extra classes as per the requirement of attendance of the specified course/professional/research program.
29. Any legal dispute relating to admission of students will be subject to Courts at Jind or Courts having jurisdiction in Jind

For Under Graduate Courses:** Sports certificate for admission will only be considered, if the candidate produces the National participation/position in school state (under 17-19 age group)/Junior State 1st, 2nd and 3rd sports certificate from the concerned National Federation/State Association/SGFI/Youth federation duly verified by the concerned Assistant Education Officer (sports) in case of school/State/National participation)/District Sports and Youth Welfare Officer (in case of Senior State/National Participation).
- B. For Post Graduate Courses-** Sports Certificate for admission will only be considered, if the candidate produces the Sports Certificate of participation position (1st/2nd/3rd) in

Senior National/ State Level Championship or above. This include (Senior National Federation Cup, National League, Inter Zonal National, National Games/National University Games) from the respective unit concerned National Federation/State Association duly verified by District Sports and Youth Welfare Officer in the respective game.

In case of sports quota seats are vacant in any stream after the 1st and 2nd merit list during the admission procedure then these vacant seats can be merged at the time of Physical Presence (waiting list).

GUIDELINES FOR WEIGHTAGE(S)

1. Total Weightage for the purpose of merit under Section-V shall not exceed 10 marks except for and B.P.Ed. And M.P.Ed. Courses.
2. Besides the one maximum higher weightage mentioned at **Sr. No. (F)** (i) to (viii) and weightage at Sr. No. (ix) And only one Weightage of the remaining categories under **Clause (A) to (E) of Section-V** would be added for the purpose of merit for admission to B.P.Ed. Course.
3. The position at National Level will only be considered if the candidate has participated in Inter-Collegiate Tournaments/ State Level Tournament in the same game/event during college period.
4. Weightage for the purpose of merit under **Clause (E) Section V** will be given only if the candidate has obtained required Certificates/Distinction during the course of the qualifying examination on the basis of which he is seeking admission to the course concerned. For example, if a candidate is seeking admission to M.A. course on the basis of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Examination he/she will be given weightage, under this clause only if he/she has obtained the required Certificate during B.A., B.Sc., or B.Com. Course.
5. Weightage/eligibility for sports/games will only be given to those sports/games which are recognized by the Association of Indian Universities. Current list of such sports/games recognized by AIU is as under:

Games for Men and Women

American Football, Aquatics, Archery, Athletics, Ball Badminton, Baseball, Boxing, Canoeing and Kayaking, Circle Style Kabaddi, Cross Country Races, Cycling Road, Cycling Track, Fencing, Gatka, Gymnastics & Malkhamb, Hockey 5's, Judo , Korf Ball, Netball, Pistol Shooting & 177, Air Rifle Peep Sight, Clay Pigeon Shooting Trap, Double Trap and Skeet,

Power Lifting, Roll Ball, Rowing, Sepak Takraw, Soft Tennis, Softball,, Squash Rackets, Taekwondo, Tug of War, Wrestling Free Style, Greco Roman Style Wrestling, Wt. Lifting and Best Physique, Wushu, Yachting, Yoga, Badminton, Basketball, Chess, Cricket, Football, Handball, Hockey, Kabaddi, Kho-Kho, Table-Tennis, Tennis, Volleyball.

Note: In addition to the sanctioned seats, additional seats for the following categories will be as under:

- A.** Two additional seats will be for outstanding sports persons in all courses over & above the sanctioned seats. Such candidates will have to submit a Grading Certificate issued by the Director, Directorate of Sports and Youth Welfare, Govt. of Haryana, Chandigarh.

Norms for Outstanding Sports Persons: Outstanding sports persons means a person who has at least represented the University/State in the Inter-University/National Level (National Championship, Federation Cup, Inter-State, National Games, and National League etc.) Tournaments recognized by Association of Indian Universities/Concerned National Federation/Indian Olympic Association in the games in which Inter-University Tournaments are organized by the Association of Indian Universities while pursuing the Under-graduate Studies. Such candidates will have to submit a Gradation Certificate issued by the Directorate of Sports and Youth Welfare, Govt. of Haryana, Chandigarh. No lower sports achievements as prescribed above will be considered for admission for outstanding sports person category, even if the seats remain vacant.

- B.** One additional seat for each NCC and NSS Merit Certificate holders who attended the R.D. Parade Camp in all courses over and above the sanctioned seats.
- C. Seats for International Students:** 15% seats in all courses are classified as Two additional seating all courses will be for Kashmiri Migrants.
- D. Supernumerary** seats for Foreign Students out of which 10% shall be earmarked for foreigners and 5% seats shall be earmarked for wards of Indians working in Gulf and South East Asia. These seats are interchangeable. Detailed rules for admission to Foreign Students are available.

SECTION-VI
PROCEDURE FOR PREPARING OF MERIT

1. Admission to all the courses (*MCA, MBA, M.Com; MA in Economics, Mass Communication, English, History, Psychology, Education, Yoga, Music & Dance; M.Sc. in Geography, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry; M.P.Ed, B.P.Ed, and P.G. Diploma in Yoga*) will be made on the basis of merit of qualifying examination plus weightages as per rule.
2. **B.P.Ed.:** After qualifying the Physical Efficiency Test (PET) admission to B.P.Ed. courses will be made on the basis of merit of qualifying examinations plus weightages as per rules.
3. In case two or more candidates in merit list have equal percentage of marks in the qualifying Examination, the marks obtained in the lower examination will be taken into consideration and in case there is still a tie, the candidate senior in age shall be considered first.
4. Final Counseling based on physical presence will be done by the concerned department at their own level. At the time of final counseling, all the vacant seats of reserved categories **except SC category seats** will be converted into General Category, in case, no candidate of respective reserve category is available and the same will be filled up on merit basis. Seats of SC category will not be filled up from another category.

IT IS THE SOLE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CANDIDATE TO ATTACH ALL NECESSARY DOCUMENTS/CERTIFICATES/TESTIMONIALS/FEEES WITH THE APPLICATION FORM. DISCREPENCY, IF ANY, SHALL NOT BE COMMUNICATED TO THE CANDIDATES BY THE DEPARTMENT.

Candidates whose name(s) appear in the Merit List will be considered eligible for admission within the prescribed time. Such candidates will have to present themselves on the scheduled time and date in the University for verification of their **ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS. NO EXCUSE WHATSOEVER SHALL BE ENTERTAINED FOR NON-PRODUCTION OF ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS.**

a) Male candidates who have gaps in their academic career after the qualifying examination, must furnish a certificate of gap and character for the gap period duly attested by Notary Public.

b) Male candidates, who are/were in service during the gap period, must furnish a certificate of employment from the employer and should also furnish separately a character certificate of the gap period duly attested by Notary Public.

c) Female candidates who have gaps in their academic career after the qualifying examination must furnish character certificate from the last institution attended.

(iii) **Candidates who have recently qualified:** Candidates who have passed/appeared in the qualifying examination in 2019 session must submit **Character Certificate** from the Head of the Institution last attended as per specimen given in **ANNEXURE-I**.

E. Bonafide Resident Certificate as per **APPENDIX-A**, if applicable. Candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from a University in the State of Haryana will be deemed

to be Haryana residents and will not be required to submit a certificate of Bonafide resident of Haryana as per guidelines of **APPENDIX-A**.

- F.** Certificate in case of candidates belonging to **Scheduled Castes (SC)** as per **ANNEXURE-II**, if applicable;

- b) **Private Candidates:** Candidates, who have passed the qualifying examination as private candidate should submit their Character Certificate, duly signed by a First-Class Magistrate.
- c) **Gap in Study:** Male Candidates, who have gap in their academic career after the Qualifying Examination, must furnish a gap certificate, in the form of affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper or certificate from the employer (if in service) and should also furnish separately a Character Certificate of gap period duly attested by Notary Public.

Note: Income declaration will be furnished by the self-employed parents/guardian of SC candidates, stating definite income from all sources by way of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper. Employed parents/guardian are required to obtain income certificates from their employer and for any additional income from other sources, they would furnish declaration by way of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper.

Eligibility Certificate

The eligibility for admission to various courses will be verified by the Chairperson of the Department concerned at their own level and after provisional admission the Registration

Branch will check all documents of admitted candidates other than State Universities/Board of Haryana.

Candidates are required to obtain an Eligibility Certificate from the Registration Branch before he/she has been admitted provisionally by the Department concerned. For Eligibility Certificate the prescribed form can be had from the concerned Department. No candidate will be given even provisional admission without obtaining Eligibility Certificate. The students who have passed their lower examination from

State Universities of Haryana other than Chaudhary Ranbir Singh University, Jind will be required to deposit Eligibility Fee of Rs 100/- along with the Fee.

Foreign Students

Candidates who have passed lower examinations from foreign Universities or Boards are required to deposit Rs.500/- as eligibility fee for obtaining Eligibility Certificate. The Eligibility Certificate will be issued by the Registration Branch on checking the required documents, such as student's visa and original documents of a foreign student. No candidate will be given even provisional admission without obtaining Eligibility Certificate

SECTION-IX
RULES FOR ADJUSTMENT/REFUND OF FEE

A. ADJUSTMENT OF FEE

If a candidate after having deposited fee for admission in one course joins another course in another University Teaching Department in the same session, as mentioned below, and is permitted to withdraw his/her candidature, fee/funds except admission fee already deposited by him/her for the course from which he/she has withdrawn, shall be adjusted/refunded against the fee/funds of the course he/she joins subject to the condition that the difference, if any, shall be paid by the candidate:

- i. from a general course to another general course;
- ii. from a general course to a self-financing course or vice-versa;
- iii. from a self-financing course to another self-financing course.

However, adjustment/refund of fee will be allowed only if the seats vacated are filled by the last date of Admission.

B. REFUND OF FEE

If a candidate withdraws from the course/programme in which he/she was admitted in the University Teaching Departments the fee to the candidate will be refunded as per following rules:

Note:

1. For withdrawal of admission fee, the candidate should submit a request in the concerned department as per date given **Section-IV**. After withdrawal, the seat shall be cancelled and allotted to next eligible candidate. Performa of **application for adjustment of Dues/Fees** at **Annexure-XV** and **application for withdrawal of admission and refund of fee** at **Annexure-XVI**.
2. In case of demise of a candidate during the period as per point no. 1, 2 and 3 above, the application of withdrawal of admission and refund of fee is to be submitted by the parents/guardian of the candidate and the fee will be refunded without any deductions.
3. * Formally-notified last date of admission is the date of display of the Final List (i.e. the date on which, candidate mark their attendance by physical presence) in the Department.
4. # inclusive of course fee and non-tuition fee but exclusive of caution money and security deposit.
5. Fee will be refunded to the eligible candidate who are covered the above criteria given at Sr. No. 1 to 4 within 30 working days from the date of closure of admission of that academic session. In the courses, which are also governed by AICTE rules, **application of refund of fee will not be admitted after 10th of August as last date for completing the admission process is 15th August.**

- c) asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- d) any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- e) exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students;
- f) any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- g) any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h) any act or abuse by spoken words, e-mails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- i) any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

All the senior students are advised to guide and treat junior students affectionately. Junior students may contact their Chairpersons or other University functionaries like Dean, Faculty Concerned, Chief Warden, Wardens or Security Officer for help and guidance.

Instructions regarding Bonafide Residents of Haryana issued vide letter No.62/17/95-6 GSI dated 3 October, 1996, No.62/32/2000-6GSI dated 23 May, 2003, No.62/27/2003-6GSI dated 29 July, 2003 and No.62/62/2011-6GSI dated 17 January, 2012 by the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana.

Subject: Bonafide residents of Haryana - Guidelines regarding.

1. I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Govt. letters noted in the margin on the subject noted above vide which the instructions were issued regarding simplification of procedure for obtaining the certificate of Domicile for the purpose of admission to educational institution (including technical/medical institution). The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgment delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Dr. Pradeep Jain vs. Union of India and others reported as AIR 1984- SC-1421, wherein it has been held that instead of the word 'Domicile' the word 'Resident' be used in the instructions issued by the State Government and it has been decided to revise the Government instructions. Henceforth, the following categories of persons would be eligible for the grant of Resident Certificate:
 - i. Candidates, who have passed the examination qualifying there for selection in an institution from a school/college in Haryana.
 - ii. Children/Wards (if parents are not living)/Dependents: -
 - a) of the regular employees of Haryana State posted in or outside Haryana State or working on deputation;
 - b) of the regular employees of the statutory bodies/corporations established by or under an act of the State of Haryana who are posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana or outside Haryana.
 - c) of the regular employees of the Government of India posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of the Haryana Government;
 - iii. Children/wards (if parents not living)/dependents of persons who after retirement have permanently settled in Haryana and draw their pensions from the treasuries situated in the State of Haryana.

- iv. Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of pensioners of Haryana Government irrespective of the fact that the original home of the retiree is in a state other than Haryana or he has settled after retirement in or outside Haryana;
 - v. Children/Wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of persons, who have permanent home in Haryana and include persons who have been residing in Haryana for a period of not less than 15 years or who have permanent home in Haryana but, on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana;
 - vi. The wives of such persons who are Bonafide residents of Haryana irrespective of the fact that they had belonged to any other State before marriage;
 - vii. Persons who were born in Haryana and produce a certificate to that effect; provided that the parents/guardians (if parents are not living) of persons belonging to any one of the above mentioned categories are:
 - a) Citizen of India;
 - b) Produce an affidavit to the effect that they or their children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents have not obtained the benefit of Resident in any other State.
 - viii. Children & Wards of the accredited journalists residing at Chandigarh and recognized by the Govt. of Haryana.
2. All candidates claiming to be Bonafide residents of Haryana should produce a Haryana Resident Certificate signed by the District Magistrate/General Assistant to Deputy Commissioner or Sub-Divisional Officer (Civil) of the District/Subdivisions/Tehsildars of Revenue to which the candidates belong. Resident Certificates in respect of elsewhere or in respect of the Children/Wards/ Dependents of Haryana Govt. employees who are posted at Chandigarh, Delhi or elsewhere or in respect of Children/Wards/Dependents of pensioners of Haryana Govt. or in respect of the Children/Wards/Department of the employees of the Government of India posted at Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of Haryana Government, or in respect of Children/Wards/ Dependents of the employees and retirees of the Statutory Bodies/Corporations of Haryana established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana or a Central Act and located at Chandigarh, Haryana or outside Haryana, should be by their respective Heads of Departments.
3. Candidates seeking admission in educational institutions (including medical and technical institutions) located in Haryana may not be required to produce Resident Certificate, if they

have passed the examination from a school/college situated in Haryana. For this purpose, a certificate of the Principal/Headmaster from concerned institution where the children/wards studied last should be considered sufficient. The Principal/Headmaster of the institution shall be competent to issue such certificate, which should be sufficient.

4. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of claim that he belongs to the State of Haryana but at any subsequent time is discovered that his claim was false, the student shall be removed from the institution, all fees and other dues paid up to the date of such removal shall be confiscated. The Principal/Headmaster may take such other action against the student and his/her parents/guardians as he may deem proper in the circumstances of any particular case.
5. The children/wards/dependents of the employees of Punjab & Haryana High Court, who are discharging their duties in connection with the affairs of the State of Haryana and have not availed facility from their parent State, the State of Punjab and U.T. Administration Chandigarh, would also be eligible for grant of Resident Certificate of the State of Haryana only for the purpose of admission in academic/technical/medical institutions of the State of Haryana. However, in that case the employees of the Punjab & Haryana High Court shall be entitled to draw this benefit at one place/State only. Head of the Department of the Punjab & Haryana High Court would be competent to issue such a certificate.

SECTION-XII
BENEFITS OF FEE FOR CANDIDATES OF HARYANA BELONGING TO THE SCHEDULED CASTE CATEGORY

There is a Post Matric Scholarship Scheme of GOI for welfare of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Caste Category. As per letter No.3/44-2012 Sch.(2) dated 18.06.2013 of the Director General Higher Education, Haryana, Panchkula. Such students, whose parents/guardian income is upto Rs. 2.50 lac per annum, are eligible for benefits under the said scheme. The benefits include enrollment/registration, tuition, games, union, library, magazine, Medical Examination and such other fees compulsorily payable by the student to the institution or University/Board. Refundable deposit like caution money, security deposit are, however, excluded. For students admitted under this scheme, the application form has to be submitted by the students to the concerned Chairperson/Director of the Department/ Institute.

Note: An income declaration shall be furnished by the self-employed parents/guardian. Employed parents are required to obtain income certificates from their employer and for any additional income from other sources; they would furnish declaration by way of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper.

1. No fee will be charged by the University from the students belonging to the Scheduled Caste Category, whose parent's Income is upto Rs. 2.50 lac p.a. They shall be admitted during the academic session 2019-20 as per instructions of the Director Higher Education, Haryana and the Director General, Technical Education Department, Panchkula, Haryana. However, as per instructions dated 01.09.2018 of the Deirector, Welfare of SC/BC Classes Department Haryana, Chandigarh, the students belonging to the Scheduled Caste Category who after verification of record by the office are found eligible for the PMS Scholarship, shall have to submit an undertaking in the Fee Section of the Accounts Branch that they will deposit their fee immediately to the institution as soon as they receive the Scholarship in their bank account.
2. Students belonging to the Scheduled Caste category who are eligible for Post Matric Scholarship Scheme should get their Saving Bank Account linked with Aadhaar Number to get transferred the funds in their respective bank accounts.
3. Students, who are eligible for Scheduled Caste and Backward Class Scholarship(s) as the case may be, may apply online on the dates which will be announced/published in the newspapers/hryscbcschemes.in/ highereduhry.com portal by the State Govt. /Funding Agencies.

Subject: Regarding prescribing minimum eligibility qualification for the various courses.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to invite your kind attention towards Government Instructions No. 3870-WGI-ASOII-64/20069 dated 6th/9th October, 1964 whereby the candidates of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes provided 5% reduction in marks in the minimum eligibility qualification for admissions in various courses.

It has come to the notice of the Government that at present where a General Category candidate is required to have 50% marks in a prescribed qualification for admission in any course, as per the above instructions a reserve category candidate is required to have 45% marks giving him 5% reduction in the minimum qualification. Vide judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court in Civil Appeal No. 7084/2011, it has been observed that the practice is wrong and the relaxation of 5% should be reduced from the minimum required marks on a general category candidate for e.g. :-

In a course, a general candidate requires to have 50% marks, than as per Govt. instructions by giving 5% relaxation the minimum eligibility marks for a reserved caste candidate should be calculated as under :-

Out of 100 Marks needs to less = 5

Out of 1 Marks needs to less = 5 / 100

Out of 50 Marks needs to less = 5 / 100 X 50 = 2.50

This way minimum less marks where general category candidates are required to have 50% in a prescribed qualification, the total required marks for a reserved candidates will be 50 - 2.50 = 47.50 and not 45.

All concerned are requested to implement the instructions as per the above procedure in the compliance of the judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court passed in CWP No. 7084/2011.

Note: Time will be recorded up to the fraction of second. The qualifying time for men and women candidates will be up to 30 seconds and 32 seconds, respectively.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

1. If a candidate commits two faults, he/she will not be allowed for re-test, whereas if only one fault is committed by the candidate, he/she will be given one more chance provided he/she completes the test within the prescribed time. Third chance will not be given under any circumstance.
2. Hurdles should be crossed without being knocked down. If a candidate leaves the test incomplete, he/she will be disqualified and will not be given any chance. If any candidate falls or slips while performing the test, he/she must complete the test and should not drop out in between and no extra chance would be given in such cases.
3. If a candidate skips any station during the circuit, he/she will be treated disqualified.
4. If any obstacles brakes during the circuit, fresh chance will be given to the candidate.
5. The decision of the obstacle judge will be final.

6. Any misbehavior/misconduct by the candidate before/during/after the PET test will be treated as disqualified for the PET.
7. The candidate appearing in the PET must wear proper sports kit, otherwise he/she will be not being allowed for the test.
8. The married female selected candidates will have to submit a certificate from SMO/MO of the university health center that she is not in family way, along with an undertaking that if during the course of study, it is found that she is in the family way, her admission would be liable to be cancelled IPSO-FACTO and all dues paid by her shall be forfeited.
9. All the candidates are required to paste original latest photo on hard copy of admission form and submit at the time of PET.
