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## UNIVERSITY PROFILE

Chaudhary Ranbir Singh University was established by the State Legislature Act 28 of 2014 on July 24, 2014, with a sprawling campus of 75 acres situated on 5<sup>th</sup> milestone on Rohtak by pass, Jind. The University was established with the vision of imparting quality education by creating most conducive ambience for the production and dissemination of knowledge guided by innovative thinking, scientific enquiry, sublime human values, sustainable ecology, and democratic ethos. The aim of the University is the cultivation of citizens with a rich awareness of our heritage to lead and serve in every sphere of human activity. Working under the leadership of eminent educationists and social reformers, Hon'ble Chancellor Shri Satyadeo Narain Arya and dedicated, dynamic and devoted personality Vice- Chancellor Prof. R.B. Solanki, the University is heading towards realization of its vision and the goal of being in the ranking by 2021.

The University is recognized u/s 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956 vide letter no. 9-12/2014 (CPP-I/PU) Dated September 26, 2014 and is also a member of the Association of Indian Universities. The University is also recognized by the University Grants Commission, New Delhi under section 12-B of the UGC Act 1956 vide letter no. F.No.9-12/2014 (CPP-I/PU) Dated January 03, 2018 to be eligible for central assistance. In a short span of five years, the university has many achievements to its credit. In addition to the academics, the students are also encouraged to participate in sports events and extracurricular activities at the campus as well as outside the campus for their wholesome personality development.

The university has launched the syllabi of Universal Human Values (UHV) to be implemented in every department from the semester beginning 2019. The goal of this program is to bring qualitative (spiritual) transformation in the personality of learners. It intends to impact their physical, mental, and spiritual self, enabling them to develop a caring attitude for others.

The university organized 2<sup>nd</sup> convocation on July 22, 2019 to award degrees to the pass out students of Ph.D, M. Phil, Post Graduate and Graduate programme in 2017 and 2018. Hon'ble Governor Sh. Satyadeo Narain Arya was the Chief Guest on the day. In the convocation two Ph.D students, 21 M.Phil Students, 878 Post Graduate students and 82 Graduate students were awarded degrees. Social thinker Shri Indresh Ji was awarded Honorary Doctorate Degree.



In addition to the academics, the students are also encouraged to participate in sports events and extracurricular activities at the campus as well as outside the campus for enable their wholesome personality development. The university has a newly constructed academic block with latest infrastructure and newly constructed Laxmi Bai Girls Hostel & Boys Hostel with ultra-modern facilities. The university has an impressive Language Labs which is open for all the students of the university to help them to improve their communication skills. The university also has a Computer lab well equipped with the latest software and is networked with 32 mbps internet speed with fiber optical device. The University has recently established Lab for Physics and Chemistry department with the state of art facilities and latest equipments'. These labs will increase the practical knowledge of M.Sc. students. Keeping in the view syllabus requirements of M.Sc. and to enhance the student's interest in research, CRSU is in process of establishment of research lab.

The Psychology lab of the university is spacious and fully equipped with latest equipment to carry out the tests. The Conference room of the university is equipped with world class facilities with a seating capacity of 40 persons. The University also has a centrally air-conditioned Auditorium Hall with all modern audio visual facilities with a sitting capacity of 240 persons. The construction for the extension of academic block, Second Computer Lab, Administrative Block, Boys Hostel, Sports Stadium and residential quarters for faculty is in full swing. The students of this university have shown commendable results in academics as well as co-curricular activities. With the present pace of progress, the university looks forward to having a promising future.

## **ACHIEVEMENTS OF UNIVERSITY**

- Two students from India who are from Chaudhary Ranbir Singh University Jind namely Mr. Vijender Mudgil and Mr. Ravinder participated with a project in "Entrepreneurship Development Programme" organized by HEBUT, China from July 1-21, 2019 and won first prize from 60 participants of 10 countries.
- 44 students of various teaching Departments of Chaudhary Ranbir Singh University, Jind qualified JRF/NET in 2019.
- The students of M.Sc. in the Department of Physics of this University got published two research paper in 'Journal of Non-Crystalline Solids' with an impact factor of 2.6.

- Training and Placement Cell of the University organized Campus Pool in the University Campus on 27<sup>th</sup> April, 2019 in which 15 companies participated, 473 students of different branches / courses were registered and 125 students were placed in different companies.
- Two girl students of University participated in South Asian Federation Game in 2016 and received highest sport “**Bhim Award**”.

## UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

Libraries are an integral part of almost all educational institutes in India. CRSU, Library is a Central facility, which caters to the informational requirements of the students, teachers, research scholars, and other staff of the University. University Library is well equipped with nearly 17851 books along with the subscription of reputed e-resources. The University Library has subscribed 22 newspapers & 6 Employment News in Hindi & English Languages. It is well equipped with the technology and infrastructure. It has five computers for the use of the Researchers, Students and Teachers. Kiosk system has also been installed for the convenience of the Library Users. The Library, at present not only allows the members to borrow books or other resources, but also provides reading rooms where the readers can study peacefully. The Library timings are from 9:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M (Issue/Return-9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.). The University Library recorded about 200 users including students and staff of the University. University Library has air conditioner reading environment. Library have the subscription of online e-resources like, Turnitin Software (Plagiarism Checker), DELNET Database, Prowess IQ ACM Digital Library, Emerald 138 ESS Journals, Sage Publications (31 Journals), South Asian Archive, World E-Book Library.

## LAXMI BAI GIRLS' HOSTEL

The University has one Girls hostel named after the Queen of Jhansi, Rani Laxmi Bai. It has the capacity of accommodating 240 girls. The hostel is provided with electronic gadgets including electric geysers, 32” Plasma TVs along with Dish/DTH facility and water cooler with RO system. The hostels subscribe to several national and regional dailies and magazines for enabling the students to know what is happening around the world. Sport facilities for girls include table tennis and badminton court, volleyball court, gym and different indoor games like carom-board and chess etc. Medical facilities to all hostel residents are provided through the University Health Centre located in the Utility Centre. The University also has a Horticulture Club

maintained by the girls of the Hostel. Beauty and skin care clinic have been established for the grooming of the students. The hostel on the campus operates its own mess providing hygienic and nutritious meals with a varied menu. In view of the large number of students applying for hostel accommodation, the university allows hostel to the students on the basis of their merit in the admission list.

### **CHHATRAPATI SHIVAJI CHHATRAWAS FOR BOYS**

The University has one boy's hostel after the name of great Indian Freedom Fighter, Chhatrapati Shivaji. It has capacity to accommodate 200 Students. The hostel has following facilities:

- Reading Hall Fully Air Conditioned.
- 125 KV Generators for 24 Hrs. Power Supply.
- Water Cooler along with RO Purifier.
- Electric Water Geyser
- Recreational Room equipped with 42 Inch Plasma TV alongwith D2H Connection.
- Subscription of Several National on Regional dailies and magazines.
- Sports facility includes Table Tennis, Badminton Court and other indoor game like Carom Board and Chess etc.
- State of Arts Dinning Facility.
- CCTV Surveillance.
- Well furnished guest rooms for parents and visitors

The Hostel on the Campus operates its own mess providing hygienic and nutritious meals with a varied menu. In of the large number of students applying for hostel accommodation, the University allows hostel to the students on the basis of their merit in the admission.

### **UNIVERSITY HEALTH CENTRE**

The Health Centre located in University Campus has sufficient space for a dispensary with patient Beds and stools with drop stand. The centre has a visiting doctor and a nurse and provides medical consultation and free medicines to all students and staff. The health centre is well equipped with all basic apparatus and general medicines. The Health Centre also provides first line of treatment in emergency cases. The process for the full-fledged development of university health centre is in process and will be accomplished soon.

## **UNIVERSITY COMPUTER AND INFORMATICS CENTRE (UCIC)**

The University Computer & Informatics Centre (UCIC) is striving to develop the University as "Digital University" and working rigorously to provide the excellent infrastructure facilities with High end systems controlled by Dell Make power Server. Central UPS with a power back up of 8 hours is controlling all the Computer Systems connected via optical fiber LAN covering the whole Campus. 24\*7 Internet facility with **500 Mbps** is available for students as well as staff members. UCIC is continuously monitoring and updating all the information on university website. The UCIC established a Computer Centre with the objective of providing readily available facilities of computers to the students and teaching and non-teaching staff of the University. It also purports to automate administrative and secretarial wings of the University with the aim to cater to the needs of the entire University. University Computer & Informatics Centre (UCIC) is providing opportunity to enhance Professional Knowledge among students and staff members. One Language lab established to improve communication skills of the student in order to compete in the era of Globalization. The University Computer & Informatics Centre (UCIC) manages the services of Video Conferencing, IPABX Telephone exchange, Centralized File Management Systems (CFMS) etc for facilitation of students & staff members.

## **LANGUAGE LAB**

The Language lab has been established to improve communication skills of the students. The Lab is equipped with latest software related to English Language and Communication. It provides a host of opportunities for students to work with online exercise sheets and virtual practice sessions, thus enabling them to learn language in a simulated environment.

## **PANDIT DEEN DAYAL UPADHAYAYA CENTRE (PDDUC)**

The Realizing the increasing gap between the Education and one of its ultimate aim of constructively using it for earning a livelihood, PDDUC was established in the campus of the University.

The main objectives of the centre, as stated and defined by the university, are mentioned below:

- Human Transformation.

- To encourage the students to be entrepreneurs and be job givers rather than remain seekers
- To encourage cooperative culture amongst the students and make them good citizens of the country.

The mandate and mission statement was Human Transformation & Entrepreneurship via Capability Enabling and Youth Empowerment. Career coaching by trained faculty was arranged from Delhi since not available locally in addition to inviting domain experts to encourage the student community to prepare for exams conducted at the centre and state level under respective Subordinate Selection Commissions. Domain experts in personality Development and communication skills were again hired from outside (since not available locally)

### **SC/ST/OBC CELL**

The SC/ST/OBC Cell has been established for the welfare of SC/ST/OBC students of the University and affiliated Colleges as per the instructions of the UGC/State Government. The Cell also functions as a Grievances Redressal Cell for the grievances of the SC/ST/OBC students and employees of the University and affiliated Colleges to provide them necessary help in solving their academic as well as administrative problems. The Cell also performed other works assigned from time to time to promote higher education among the communities suffering from economic, social and educational deprivations. To aware the students about various schemes, scholarship and various facilities provide by Central and State Government. The main objective of the SC/ST/OBC Cell is to ensure proper implementation of various schemes of University Grants Commission/Government of India/State Government introduced from time to time.

### **GUIDANCE AND COUNSELLING CELL**

Different programs are being organized under guidance and counseling cell of the University. A one day “*Sakshakta Se Sarthakta ke Or*” program was organized on February 9<sup>th</sup>, 2019 in Laxmi Bai Hostel for students of the university campus. Total 125 students attended the program. The goal of the program was to make students aware of the demands of present work environment, discovering their own self and its empowerment and how to develop themselves as entrepreneurs. This program was organized by collective efforts of Director of Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhaya Center- Col. Mehar Singh Dahiya and Convener of Guidance & Counseling Cell- Dr. Alka Seth.

## **TRAINING & PLACEMENT CELL**

Training and Placement Cell will invite and host companies on campus to hold recruitments for our students and despite the job market looking bleak this time round consists of students from different courses in their final year. The aim is to invite companies from various fields in order to make opportunities available not just for students of business but also for the students of science and arts.

Training and Placement Cell will also organize workshops and job for them. In addition, Training and Placement Cell will also organize different activities to enhance the skills of the students like:

- Soft Skills Development
- Career Building
- Mock Group Discussions
- Mock Interviews

## **EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL**

The university has constituted Equal opportunity cell to provide equal opportunity to all including the persons with disability. In addition, it will also examine all the possible ways in which SC/ST, OBC and all other minority groups could be helped.

## **VIGILANCE CELL**

The university has constituted Vigilance cell to activate vigilance machinery for investigating complaints and sensitizing the university community against corruption and corrupt practices. The main objective of this cell is to prevent the possibilities of corruption and to encourage a culture of honesty and integrity.

## **RESEARCH CELL**

The university has constituted the Research Cell to facilitate and promote quality research in emerging areas of higher education with focus on new frontiers and to act as a knowledge power- house capable of contributing to the national development and welfare of the society.

## **INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)**

IQAC plays an important role in improving the quality of higher education in University system. Considering the same and with the sprit to enhance the quality in education, IQAC cell was established in the year 2014.

Since its establishment, IQAC is working hard and making best possible efforts to achieve the goal. As this cell is related for quality, hence various sub committees have been constituted to complete the work in time bound manner with promising efficiency. Number of workshops have been done and planned in near future. Sufficient emphasis is being tried to give for research also, which is one of the crucial factors in achieving good score in NAAC.

### **INTERNAL COMPLAINT COMMITTEE (ICC)**

The University is committed to provide to all women a place of work and study free of sexual harassment, intimidation and exploitation. It is expected that all students, faculty, staff, karamcharis and officials treat one another and visitors to the University with respect. Reports of sexual behavior are taken seriously and dealt with promptly.

Sexual harassment can take place in various forms; some subtle and indirect, some blatant and overt. For instance any one or more of the following acts of unwelcome behavior (directly or by implication); physical contact and advances, A demand or request for sexual favors, Making sexually colored remarks, Showing pornography, any other unwelcome physical, verbal or nonverbal conduct of sexual nature.

As per policy the University constitutes ICC every year representing different stakeholders. Students can take help of ICC without any hesitation. Complaints can be made directly to any member of ICC or through existing channels of lodging grievances.

### **SPORTS ACTIVITIES**

These all activities Sports activities of the university are being run under the Chaudhary Ranbir Singh University Sports Council (CRSUSC). The university has the following playfields: Handball (two), Football, Volleyball, Netball, Korfball, Kho-Kho (two), Kabaddi , Basketball, Tennis, Table Tennis, Cricket ground, Shooting Range, GYM and Athletic Track 400 meters. The university is going to have its International level Sports Stadium soon. The university provides different sports facilities to its players taking part in the inter university tournaments like free TA & DA, sport kit and track suit, free medical facility and cash award to the players winning positions in these tournaments.

- CRS University Kabaddi (CS) men won gold medal All India Inter University kabaddi championship held at Reva University Raipur, Chhattisgarh.
- CRS University 18 male/female players participate in Khelo India University games 2020.
- A University team consisting of 32 candidates participated in North Zone/All India Inter University Tournament 2019-20.

## **NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME**

National Service Scheme (NSS) promotes the spirit of voluntary work among the students and teachers through sustained community interactions. It brings academic institutions near to the society. It shows how to combine knowledge and action to achieve results, which are desirable for community development. NSS at Chaudhary Ranbir Singh University was established with the objective of providing the youth an opportunity to develop their overall personality by taking part in various Social Service Schemes. The University has initiated the process of students' enrolment. Students will be given opportunity to participate in state and national level camps. Merit certificates are provided to students, who perform well in the camps. The NSS unit organized special camp on digital financial literacy and four students also received appreciation from MHRD, Government of India. In academic session 2019-20, total 8 numbers of NSS Volunteers from Haryana participated in Republic Day Parade 2020, out of these 8, two volunteers were from Jurisdiction of CRSU, Jind. Special Awareness Campaigns like Mask Making Training, Visit to Quarantine Centers, Social Distancing, and Installation of Aarogya Setu App were organized to fight with Pandemic COVID-19.

## **YOUTH RED CROSS**

The Youth Red Cross (YRC) Zone of the University is the part of Indian Red Cross Society. It is set up in educational institutions with an objective to aware people about HIV Aids, Service to the sick and suffering, protection of health and life, promotion of national and international friendship to develop the mental and moral capacities of Youth. It organizes Awareness Campaigns, First Aid Training, Fire Fighting Training, Voluntary Blood Donation, Yoga and other physical fitness exercises. Its volunteers also lend a helping hand in relief work during emergencies like flood, fire, earthquake draught and other natural calamities. It also organizes National, State and Universities Level YRC campus for the students during December/January every year. There is YRC unit of 50 students in the University campus and all its affiliated colleges. The Youth Red Cross , CRSU, Jind organized 5 Day students Training Camp from 7<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> Jan 2020 in association with Indian Red Cross Society, Jind at University campus.

## **STUDENTS WELFARE ACTIVITIES**

The office of Dean Students' Welfare is established in any institution with an objective to carry out Student Welfare activities through various programs, policies and projects to further facilitate conducive & healthy environment for the holistic and multidimensional development of students of the University. Various sports, cultural, social outreach programs, Awareness Campaigns, Lecture series, Workshops, Seminars, and conferences on themes of contemporary relevance are conducted throughout the session and all possible support is extended to the students for honing their talent. The bus and railway pass facilities are also provided to the bona fide students of UTD. The projects like establishing University Health Centre, well-furnished separate common room for boys and girls and GIS are in pipeline. To promote the sports activities in campus, UTD Sports Committee has been constituted which takes trials of the teams to be sent to compete at national and international level and organize various sports activities like Annual Athletic Meet, Cross Country Run etc. Beside this the Sports kits and other sports items are also purchased on the recommendations of UTD Sports committee. UTD, Teams of Chaudhary Ranbir Singh University, Jind participated in various Tournaments and created a niche for themselves on national and international level during the session 2019-20.

## **DIRECTORATE OF YOUTH WELFARE AND CULTURAL AFFAIRS**

Directorate of Youth and Cultural Affairs aims at ensuring the welfare of students by conceiving and organizing programmes for the establishment of a healthy cultural environment in the university. It motivates

students to participate in various cultural activities to ensure their holistic development and showcase their talent in various art forms. 1. Prospectus containing eligibility conditions, list of participating institutions with no. of sanctioned seats, code No. of Colleges/Institutes can be seen/downloaded from University website [www.crsu.ac.in](http://www.crsu.ac.in).
2. Before filling the online Application Form, the candidates are required to read the prospectus carefully. For any query, please contact the helpline telephone numbers for the applicants and for the colleges the same will be mentioned here after receiving from the concerned agency.
3. The Admission to M.Ed. and M.Ed. (Special) Courses for the session 2020-21 will be made on the basis of inter-se merit of percentage of the Qualifying Examination through online counselling by C.R.S.U. Jind.
4. No one who is already in employment (whole time or part time or in honorary capacity) shall be admitted to the M.Ed. (Regular) Course in any College of Education without taking leave from the employer for full academic session.
5. It will be the responsibility of the candidate to ensure eligibility for admission before applying for the course. If on verification at a later stage, it is found that a candidate does not fulfil the eligibility conditions, his/her candidature will be cancelled and the fee deposited by him/her shall be forfeited.
6. On-line registration-cum-counselling fee is Rs. 1000/-. Registration cum Counselling fee is non-refundable.
7. On-line registration-cum-Counselling fee shall be deposited by the candidate online through Credit / Debit Cards and Net Banking on the charges already fixed by IDBI.
8. All the candidates must verify their personal information during online registration.
9. Locking of submitted choices is advisable, however, candidates who do not lock the choices, their last filled choice would be considered final.
10. Registered candidates who do not fill choices or fail to save the same cannot be considered for admission and seat allotment.
11. Candidates must take print-out of their online Application Form along with their locked choices. This print-out has to be signed and submitted at the time of reporting for admission.
12. The outcome of counselling will be displayed on [www.crsu.ac.in](http://www.crsu.ac.in) as per admission schedule. No individual allotment letter will be sent to the candidates. They will have to download by applying Registration and password allotted to them and report to the allotted college from the website i.e. [www.crsu.ac.in](http://www.crsu.ac.in).
13. All the candidates who are allotted seats will report to allotted college/institute within stipulated date, failing which their seat allotment shall stand cancelled. Also, they will not be considered for further Counsellings.
14. Candidates will produce all the relevant certificates in original including registration-cum- counselling fee receipt for verification along with provisional allotment letter, a signed print out of their online application form, their locked choices generated from the website at the time of reporting.
15. At the time of reporting, if documents are found to be correct on verification by the college then provisional admission/ auto upgradation letter generated online will be issued to the candidate by the concerned college. The candidate shall check all the entries in this provisional admission/ auto up-gradation letter and should sign it and preserve it for further reference.
16. The allotment of seats is liable to be cancelled, if the personal data viz. Category, residential status (Bonafide Residents of Haryana or All India Category), percentage of marks in qualifying examination,



gender etc. submitted by the candidates at the time of registration is found to be wrong at the time of verification of the original certificates at Allotted Institutes. But, if the candidate is found to be eligible after the correction in personal data, the candidate may be considered for subsequent rounds of counseling, if any, against the vacancies only.

17. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of the information submitted by him/ her, which is found to be incorrect or false at any stage then his/ her admission shall be cancelled and all fees and other dues paid by him/ her shall be forfeited. The University/ College/ Institute may take further action, as deemed fit, against the candidate in accordance with law.
18. Candidate seeking admission are advised to ensure that they are lawfully admitted failing which, they shall not be authenticated and registered by the CRSU, Jind and they themselves shall be responsible for any such lapse.
19. All the rules and regulations for submission of migration certificates by the candidates who have passed the qualifying examinations from other Universities will be applicable as per the rules of the CRSU, Jind.
20. In case, a candidate after having deposited required fee for admission to M.Ed. and M.Ed. (Special), Courses for the session 2020-21 decides to leave the said courses before the last round of counselling, the fee deposited by the candidate will be refundable to him/her by the concerned college if the seat so vacated is filled by some other candidate after deducting Rs. 1,000/- only.
21. In case of ambiguity about any rule, the interpretation of the same by the University shall be final.
22. All legal disputes relating to admission to these courses, will be subject to Courts having jurisdiction at Jind.
23. The number of colleges/sanctioned seats may increase or decrease based upon the approval and affiliation from the University.

## **INSTRUCTIONS FOR COLLEGES**

1. Every College shall constitute an Admission Committee to be appointed by the Principal from amongst the teachers of College.
2. Verification of the documents of the candidate will be made by the respective Admission Committee of College at the time of reporting for admission, by comparing with the original certificates against which candidate has been allotted seat. Any entry or information filled/made by the candidate, if found to be false, shall entail automatic cancellation of admission.
3. The admission committee may ensure that the Candidate has deposited the fee as per his/her entitlement.
4. Online reporting should be done as and when candidate reports at institute and not on the last date of admission.
5. After successful admission of the candidate, the institute must issue system generated provisional admission slip/auto upgradation letter to candidate.
6. Colleges are required to update admission status online on [www.crsu.ac.in](http://www.crsu.ac.in) strictly as per admission schedule so that the subsequent counseling may be conducted as per schedule, failing which they will be fined heavily.
7. All admissions by colleges are to be updated/ reported online, as and when they admit the candidates. No permission of any kind would be provided for admitting students, if status of admission not reported online as per Key dates/schedule.
8. Information about only those candidates, whose admission status has been reported online, will be forwarded to Registration Branch of University
9. Responsibility for any wrong/irregular/excess admission will entirely rest upon the Principal concerned.
10. Admission of candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from other University shall be provisional subject to verification of the eligibility by the Registration Branch of the University.
11. All the rules and regulations for submission of Registration Return of students by the college will be applicable as per the rules of the University.
12. Every College must give accurate information on its website regarding human and instructional resources alongwith subjects in which teachers are available in the College.
13. Under no circumstances the original certificates of the candidate should be retained by the college. The candidate seeking admission will submit two sets of his/ her documents/certificates duly Self attested by Candidate, at the time of reporting in the college. The Principal of the college will authenticate these documents/ certificates after comparing these from the originals and the originals will be returned to the candidate. One set of these documents/certificates thus authenticated by the college shall be deposited in the University, for the purpose of registration, for which no original certificate shall be demanded. Anyhow, if the University, so desires the original certificates from the candidate can be demanded through the Institute of his/her admission for any purpose what so ever these may be.

## **ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS FOR ADMISSION**

### **Eligibility as per NCTE norms:**

#### **Master of Education (M.Ed.) 2 Yr. (Semester System) course:**

The admission for the Degree of M.Ed. Programme shall be open to candidates having atleast 50% marks or an equivalent grade in any of the following programmes:

- (i) B.Ed.
- (ii) B.A.B.Ed, B.Sc.B.Ed
- (iii) B.El.Ed.
- (iv) D.El.Ed with an undergraduate degree (with 50% marks in each)

### **Eligibility as per RCI norms:**

#### **Master of Education (M.Ed.) Special Education 2 Yr. (Semester System) course:**

The admission for the degree of M.Ed. Spl.Ed. degree shall be open to:

- (a) A candidate who has successfully passed B.Ed Spl. Ed. With minimum 50% marks in respective disability area from a recognized University or any other degree considered equivalent to B.Ed.Spl.Ed. from an affiliating University and/or teaching department under any University recognized by U.G.C. with RCI registration/recognition.
- (b) A candidate who has successfully passed the B.Ed. General Course and has successfully completed Diploma in Education (Special Education) in respective disability are recognized by the Rehabilitation Council of India with minimum 50 percent marks in each course.
- (c) A candidate who has successfully passed the B.Ed. General course and has successfully completed Post Graduate Professional Diploma (PGPD) in Special Education in concerned disability (till Academic Session 2014-15).
- (d) A candidate with B.Ed.Spl.Ed. in particular specialization may be allowed for M.Ed.Spl.Ed. cross disability/multicategory (as and when offered) but the reverse is not allowed. B.Ed.Spl.Ed. with multi-category should not be admitted for specialization in a single disability at the B.Ed.Spl.Ed. level, however, these can be admitted to B.Ed.Spl.Edu. Area C Courses and complete the Specialization Courses to qualify for a particular disability. On completion of Area C, these can be admitted to the M.Ed.Spl.Ed. in a specific disability.
- (e) A student with B.A/B.Sc./B.Com.B.Ed.Spl.Ed (4 years Integrated course in concerned area of disability).
- (f) Candidate should have valid RCI registration.

### **Note:**

- (i) There shall be no rounding off of percentage of marks of the qualifying examination from 0.5% and above to next higher number for determining the eligibility i.e. 49.5% and above will not be rounded off to 50%.
- (ii) 47.5% marks for SC/ST candidates of Haryana State only. As per instructions from state Govt. letter dated :-16-07-2014
- (iii) 47.5% marks for Blind/Persons with Disabilities and visually/Hearing Impaired candidates.
- (iv) Compartmental candidates will not be allowed admission in M.Ed. (Regular Course) in any case.
- (v) Cut off date for eligibility will be the last date/time of online choice filling.

### **Eligibility for PGDRP:**

- a. Bachelor's degree (regular mode) with general psychology courses in all the three years, or
- b. Master's degree in any branch of psychology either in regular or distance mode, or
- c. Master's degree in counseling psychology either in regular or distance mode 5 with a minimum of 55% marks in aggregate. For SC/ST/OBC category, minimum of 50% marks in aggregate is essential. Entry qualification shall be from a UGC recognized university.

## **PREPARATION OF MERIT LIST FOR ADMISSION**

Merit for admission to M.Ed. Course shall be determined on the basis of marks obtained in the Qualifying examination. However, if two or more candidates have obtained Equal marks, following procedure will be used for the preparation of merit:

- (i) Candidate senior in age will be given first preference
- (ii) If tie still persists, then marks obtained in 12th will be considered
- (iii) If tie still persists, then marks in 10th will be considered to break the tie

## ONLINE ADMISSION PROCEDURE

This section provides an overview of the steps involved in counselling and admission process.

### A. Online Registration

- (i) Candidate should visit website [www.crsu.ac.in](http://www.crsu.ac.in).
- (ii) Candidates should go through prospectus for gathering information/instruction in details about Counselling schedules and procedures. Softcopy is available on the websites [www.crsu.ac.in](http://www.crsu.ac.in)
- (iii) Candidates will register themselves as per key dates mentioned in the admission schedule for Self-Financing Colleges of Education affiliated to this University.
- (iv) For participation in online admission process, a candidate has to register by submitting personal data/requisite information correctly in the online application form. On submitting this data/information user Id and password will be generated/ created for use in future logins by the candidate.
- (v) For subsequent logins, candidates will be able to login directly with their user Id and password. Candidates should remember to logout at the end of their session so that the details filled by them cannot be tampered with or modified by unauthorized person.
- (vi) Candidates are advised to record/remember their password for future logins and not to disclose or share their password with anybody.
- (vii) It is solely the responsibility of the candidates to verify that their personal data including Category, Subcategory, Residential Status, gender etc are consistent with documentary evidence.
- (viii) If the personal data submitted /entered by the candidates are found to be wrong at the time verification of certificate either during reporting or at a later stage, the allotment of seat/ provisional admission is liable to be cancelled.
- (ix) Candidates should take a print out (hard copy) of the online application form containing the above personal data for future use.

### B. Payment of Registration & Counseling Fee.

- (i) All the candidates will be required to deposit processing charges through Netbanking/Credit Card/Debit Card .
- (ii) Remember you have paid your registration-cum-counseling fee before proceeding for online counseling, otherwise your allotted seat can be CANCELLED at any stage and candidate would not have any claim on such allotted seat.

### C. Online Choice Filling & Locking

- (i) Online choice filling & locking by the candidate can be done as per key dates mentioned in the admission schedule for Self-Financing Colleges of Education affiliated to this University.
- (ii) If the fee is paid by a candidate through internet banking/credit card/debit card, then the choice filling open will be activated immediately otherwise the candidate has to wait for next day to get his/her option activated.
- (iii) Candidates are advised to go through the updated list of Colleges of Education affiliated to this University on the website [www.crsu.ac.in](http://www.crsu.ac.in) and should prepare a list of Colleges in order of preference in which they are interested in seeking admission.
- (iv) Candidates can fill in as much number of choices in order of preference as they wish to. Candidates are allowed to change or re-order their choices, delete earlier choices and add new choices any number of times until they lock their final choices.
- (v) All the candidates must lock their final choices as per key dates mentioned in the admission schedule.
- (vi) Candidates will not be able to unlock their choices once they are locked.
- (vi) If candidate fail to explicitly lock their choices by the last date, their last saved choices will be automatically locked and allotment will be done on this basis.
- (viii) Candidate must take a print out of their locked choices. This print out has to be signed and submitted at the time of reporting for admission.
- (ix) Registered candidates who do not fill choices or fail to save the same cannot be considered for admission and seat allotment.

### D. Indicative seat Availability (Mock Counseling)

Based on the number of registered candidates who have submitted their choices before the key dates mentioned in the admission schedule, the system will be able to provide an idea of the seats that candidates

may be offered for M.Ed. course in Self Financing Scheme Colleges only. The indicative seat availability will be displayed on the websites [www.crsu.ac.in](http://www.crsu.ac.in) as per key dates mentioned in the admission schedule. Candidates are advised to visit the websites [www.crsu.ac.in](http://www.crsu.ac.in) for this purpose. The final allotment of seat, in the allotment rounds may be different than the indicative seat availability.

### **E. Online Seat Allotment**

#### **First Counseling**

- (i) Seats will be allotted in the order of merit and preference/ choices as per admission schedule as mentioned. The allotment result will be available on the websites [www.crsu.ac.in](http://www.crsu.ac.in). Individual allotment letters will not be sent to the candidates. However, candidates may get a print out of the allotment details from the above websites.
- (ii) Candidates who are allotted seats will have to personally report to the allotted college.

#### **Second Counseling**

- (i) Seat will be allotted against vacant seats available after the first round of allotment and reporting.
- (ii) Registered candidates will not be allowed to alter or resubmit their choices.
- (iii) Eligible candidates for allotment against vacant seats fall into one of the following two groups:
  - Group-I: Candidates who reported at the allotted college after first round of seat allotment and opted for all the choices of preference higher than the currently allotted seat (auto upgradation) to be considered in the subsequent round(s).
  - Group-II: Registered candidates who were not allotted any seats in the first round of seat allotment.
- (iv) Candidates who, at any stage, cancel their provisional admission will not be considered for the subsequent round(s) of counseling. Also, if candidates fail to satisfy the minimum educational qualifications prescribed, their allotment of the seat shall automatically stand cancelled and such candidates will not be considered for the subsequent round(s) of counseling. Candidates opting for auto upgradation shall automatically forego his/ her claim on the seat previously allotted. Similar procedure will be used in the subsequent round(s) of the seat allotment.

### **F. Reporting at Allotted College/Institute**

- (i) The outcome of the different rounds of seat allotment will be displayed on the websites [www.crsu.ac.in](http://www.crsu.ac.in). (as per admission schedule). Individual allotment letters will not be sent to the candidates by the university.
- (ii) All the candidates who get an allotment should take print out of this provisional seat allotment and will report to the allotted College/Institute as per specified reporting dates for taking admission, failing which their seat allotment shall stand cancelled. Also, they will not be considered for further rounds of seat allotment.
- (iii) Candidates will produce all the relevant certificates in original including registration and counselling fee receipt for verification alongwith provisional allotment letter, a signed print out of their online application form, their locked choices generated from the website at the time of reporting.
- (iv) At the time of reporting if documents are found correct on verification and the fee is paid (as mentioned in the prospectus) by the candidate, then a provisional admission letter generated online will be issued to the candidate by the concerned college. The candidate shall check all the entries in this provisional admission letter and should sign it and preserve it for further reference.
- (v) At the time of reporting if documents are found correct on verification and candidate opt for auto upgradation, then a provisional auto up-gradation letter generated online will be issued to the candidate by the concerned college. The candidate shall check all the entries in this provisional auto up-gradation letter and should sign it and preserve it for further reference.
- (vi) The allotment of their seats is liable to be cancelled, if the personal data viz. Category, Sub-category, residential status (Bonafide Residents of Haryana or All India Category), percentage of marks in qualifying examination, gender etc. submitted by the candidates at the time of registration is found to be wrong at time of verification of the original certificates at allotted Institutes, But, if the candidate is found to be eligible after the correction in personal data, the candidate may be considered for subsequent rounds of counseling, if any, against the vacancies only.
- (vii) If a candidate is admitted on the basis of the information submitted by him/ her, which is found to be incorrect or false at any stage then his/ her admission shall be cancelled and all fees and other dues

paid by him/ her shall be forfeited. The University/ College/ Institute may take further action, as deemed fit, against the candidate in accordance with law.

- (viii) The allotment of the seats to candidates who do not report within the stipulated period to the allotted college will be cancelled and these candidates will not be considered in the seats allotment in the subsequent couplings

- (j) Certificate from Ex-Servicemen of Indian Deference Services or Para-Military Forces-Annexure-VII.

Instructions regarding Bonafide Residents of Haryana issued vide letter No.62/17/95-6 GSI dated 3rd October, 1996, No.62/32/2000-6GSI dated 23rd May, 2003, No.62/27/2003-6GSI dated 29th July, 2003 and No.62/62/2011-6GSI dated 17th January, 2012 by the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana.

**Subject: Bonafide residents of Haryana - Guidelines regarding.**

1. I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Govt. letters noted in the margin on the subject noted above vide which the instructions were issued regarding simplification of procedure for obtaining the certificate of Domicile for the purpose of admission to educational institution (including technical/medical institution). The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgment delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Dr. Pradeep Jain vs. Union of India and others reported as AIR 1984-SC-1421, wherein it has been held that instead of the word 'Domicile' the word 'Resident' be used in the instructions issued by the State Government and it has been decided to revise the Government instructions. Henceforth, the following categories of persons would be eligible for the grant of Resident Certificate:-
  - (I) Candidates, who have passed the examination qualifying there for selection in an institution from a school/college in Haryana.
  - (II) Children/Wards (if parents are not living)/Dependents: -
    - (i) of the regular employees of Haryana State posted in or outside Haryana State or working on deputation;
    - (ii) of the regular employees of the statutory bodies/corporations established by or under an act of the State of Haryana who are posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana or outside Haryana.
    - (iii) of the regular employees of the Government of India posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of the Haryana Government;
  - (III) Children/wards (if parents not living)/dependents of persons who after retirement have permanently settled in Haryana and draw their pensions from the treasuries situated in the State of Haryana.
  - (IV) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of pensioners of Haryana Government irrespective of the fact that the original home of the retiree is in a state other than Haryana or he has settled after retirement in or outside Haryana,
  - (V) Children/Wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of persons, who have permanent home in Haryana and include persons who have been residing in Haryana for a period of not less than 15 years or who have permanent home in Haryana but on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana;
  - (VI) The wives of such persons who are bonafide residents of Haryana irrespective of the fact that they had belonged to any other State before marriage;
  - (VII) Persons who were born in Haryana and produce a certificate to that effect; provided that the parents/guardians (if parents are not living) of persons belonging to any one of the above mentioned categories are :
    - (i) Citizen of India;
    - (b) Produce an affidavit to the effect that they or their children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents have not obtained the benefit of Resident in any other State.

- (VIII) Children & Wards of the accredited journalists residing at Chandigarh and recognized by Govt. of Haryana.
2. All candidates claiming to be bonafide residents of Haryana should produce a Haryana Resident Certificate signed by the District Magistrate/General Assistant to Deputy Commissioner or Sub-Divisional Officer (Civil) of the District/Sub-Divisions/Tehsildars of Revenue to which the candidates belong. Resident Certificates in respect of elsewhere or in respect of the Children/Wards/Dependents of Haryana Govt. employees who are posted at Chandigarh, Delhi or elsewhere or in respect of Children/Wards/Dependents of pensioners of Haryana Govt. or in respect of the Children/Wards/Department of the employees of the Government of India posted at Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of Haryana Government, or in respect of Children/Wards/Dependents of the employees and retirees of the Statutory Bodies/Corporations of Haryana established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana or a Central Act and located at Chandigarh, Haryana or outside Haryana, should be by their respective Heads of Departments.
  3. Candidates seeking admission in educational institutions (including medical and technical institutions) located in Haryana may not be required to produce Resident Certificate, if they have passed the examination from a school/college situated in Haryana. For this purpose, a certificate of the Principal/Headmaster from concerned institution where the children/wards studied last should be considered sufficient. The Principal/Headmaster of the institution shall be competent to issue such certificate, which should be sufficient.
  4. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of claim that he belongs to the State of Haryana but at any subsequent time is discovered that his claim was false, the student shall be removed from the institution, all fees and other dues paid up to the date of such removal shall be confiscated. The Principal/Headmaster may take such other action against the student and his/her parents/guardians as he may deem proper in the circumstances of any particular case.
  5. The children/wards/dependents of the employees of Punjab & Haryana High Court, who are discharging their duties in connection with the affairs of the State of Haryana and have not availed facility from their parent State, the State of Punjab and U.T. Administration Chandigarh, would also be eligible for grant of Resident Certificate of the State of Haryana only for the purpose of admission in academic/technical/medical institutions of the State of Haryana. However, in that case the employees of the Punjab & Haryana High Court shall be entitled to draw this benefit at one place/State only. Head of the Department of the Punjab & Haryana High Court would be competent to issue such a certificate.

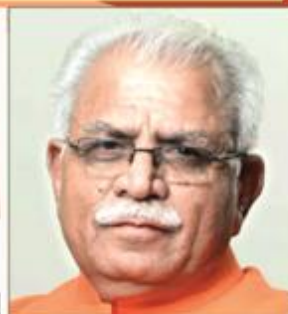
