The Library has an Audio-Visual Room with Projector. Internet Access facility are also available for the Library Members. The Students and faculty members are getting greatly benefited from this Extended facility. The Library now has of two computer stations with specialized software for visually challenged students. This year two New Reading Hall was established with Air Conditioner facility with seating capacity of 62 persons. One other Reading Hall is getting ready and will be functioning soon. The Library has an up-to-date on line catalogue (OPAC) of its holdings for all the users. UGC is facilitating the availability of E-books in the colleges through the "National Library and Information Services infrastructure for scholarly content (N-List)" Programme funded by MHRD, Government of India. The programme facilitates access about 97000 + e-books and 6000 + e-Journals to all those who access that Programme in the college Library.
