The National Law Institute University, Bhopal launched B. A. LL. B. (Hons.) Course on 1 September 1998. Since then the NLIU family is actively engaged in teaching, research, publication and training. We started postgraduate studies from the Academic Year 2001-2002 and introduced LL. M. and Ph. D. Programs. LL. M. Program was put in abeyance for some time. In the Academic Year 2007-2008 we introduced LL. M. Program in three streams, namely: (i) Law, Science and Technology, (ii) Human Rights Law, and (iii) LL. M. (General). #### **ACADEMICS AND COURSES** MASTER OF LAW AT NATIONAL LAW INSTITUTE UNIVERSITY

Master of Law as a course empowers and equips the students to attain command over any subject of law and its respective domain. Pursuing such a course with a specialization aids in achieving an overall grip over the intricacies of the subject. While a graduation in law develops a holistic understanding, a Master of Law Program gives direction in a particular branch of law.

The Master of Law (LL.M.) Programme was launched in 2007, with the first batch graduating in 2009. NLIU admits students for its Master of Law Program through the scores of CLAT PG. The LL.M. Program at NLIU is structured over a span of **One year**, divided into two Semesters. Students are offered three different branches of specialisation namely:

#### 1. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS AND BUSINESS LAW 2. CONSTITUTIONAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE LAW 3. HUMAN RIGHTS AND CRIMINAL LAW

Each specialisation offers a holistic and comprehensive study of the subject. The courses include papers having National as well as International aspects. Students are required to submit a Dissertation on the topic of their interest at the end of the Second Semester. For the sad purpose, each student is assigned under a faculty mentor who guides the student throughout his journey for coming up with quality research work.

For the said purposes, the Placement Coordination Committee (PCC) for the LL.M Batch of 2021 has been constituted from amongst the students of the Batch. It comprises of six members, having representation of two members from each specialization, headed by a Student Coordinator and, under the guidance of a faculty member. The PCC provides a transparent, credible, and accountable interface between prospective employers and graduating students. It organizes several personality development and awareness programs as a part of the learning process for the students.

The Committee is engaged in coordinating internships and placements, for which it seeks to instill functional knowledge and specific skills amongst the students by:

- 1. Organising workshops and seminars conducted by various luminaries on Placement-related subjects and topics
- 2. Organising regular career counseling, mock interviews, and group discussion programmes for the graduating batch.
- 3. Providing regular counselling and personalized career guidance to the students.

#### **PLACEMENT PROCESS**

The University conducts the campus placement process throughout the academic year of students.

The Placement Coordination Committee (PCC) ensures optimal flexibility to all prospective recruiters. The recruiters are requested to follow the following steps in conducting the recruitment process (the steps are neither mandatory nor exhaustive):

**Pre-Placement Talks:** Before conducting Pre-Interview Screening, the recruiters may conduct Pre-Placement Talks (PPT) highlighting the profile of the organization, job description, career prospects, compensation packages, and other information.

**Pre-Interview Screening Process:** The recruiters may conduct Pre-Interview Screening Process at any time before the final interview. The Curricula Vitae of all the interested students will be forwarded to the recruiter by PCC, and the recruiters are free to determine their own policy for the Screening Process to shortlist students.

**Final Interview:** 

After the Pre-Interview Screening Process, the recruiters shall conduct final interviews of all the shortlisted students. The list of selected students must be communicated to the PCC along with a waitlist of students.

**Results:** 

The results of all the stages of recruitment process shall be declared by the PCC at the end of the process.

In order to ensure that no recruiter or student is prejudiced, following guidelines are requested to be followed during the recruitment process:

- students only though a formal channel, i.e. through PCC.
- PCC which will then be conveyed to the students.
- 3. Any offer made to applicant(s) will be only through the PCC.

#### **Guidelines for Pre-Placement Talk**

The recruiters have the option of engaging the students in an interactive session via video-conferencing; highlighting the salient features of the organisation, the job profile being offered, remuneration, terms and conditions of employment and other relevant information as the recruiter thinks fit. They may also conduct lectures on niche areas of law. The recruiters are urged to indicate their preferred dates for such talks to the PCC, either by e-mail or telephonic communication, at least a week in advance.

#### **Guidelines for Recruitment Day**

Recruiters are welcome to follow their own recruitment process, broadly within the framework of group discussions, written tests, and personal interviews. The PCC sits as an impartial judge to oversee that the processes are being carried out with utmost fairness that is the hallmark of this University and to ensure that the Recruiters are facilitated at every step in their assessment processes. Recruiters can also opt for Telephonic Interviews and interviews via Video Conferencing.

The recruiters are requested to intimate the PCC with their preferred dates in the final placement schedule at the earliest
