Library

A place for intellectual growth and development, the college library is digitalized as per latest regulations (with e-book and internet facility) and follows the open access system. The library houses over a lakh book titles ranging from Biotechnology, Geometry to A Song of Ice and Fire (Game of Thrones). It subscribes to 68 journals, twelve newspapers in four languages and has twenty sets of encyclopedias and 200 educational CDs.

Students can also access the facility of departmental libraries and they may contact their department for the same. Our library also provides special services for the visually impaired students by making assistive technologies accessible with the help of our Equal Opportunity Cell and the DULS. We also have material in Braille in the library.

ICT facility

The entire campus and hostel is Wi-Fi enabled. We have our own active directory domain server for Wi-Fi security and network security and provide every student, faculty and staff with their unique ID. Our internet resource lab has 80 systems and we have three computer labs with 130 systems for student's use. Apart from this, we provide laptops to our faculty and students with disability. Seamless internet connectivity makes teaching-learning fun and engaging at Sri Venkateswara college.

Bioinformatics Center

The center was established in the year 2006 with an objective to promote Biology teaching through Bioinformatics, with initial funding from the Department of Biotechnology (DBT) under the Biotechnology Information System (BTISnet) program. It is the first Bioinformatics Center established in the University of Delhi and North India for the benefit of students at the undergraduate level. The BIC caters to the computational and bioinformatics needs of the undergraduate students, research scholars and teaching staff members from various departments in the college. Short-term training programs are offered to students from colleges and universities all over India. (www.bic-svc.ac.in)

Medical Room

Ensuring our students and staff well-being has always been our first priority. We have a medical room with a trained nurse to take care of medical emergencies in the college.

Banking Facility

The South Campus branch of the Andhra bank (now Union Bank) is situated within the college premises. It eases the trouble of banking for students and staff alike.

Eco friendly Campus

The college has nurtured a botanical garden for the requirements of the students of Botany and Life Sciences departments. However, the botanical garden is open to all and our staff is happy and eager to share knowledge and information with those interested in plant life and ecology. We have lush green lawns and a good variety of trees. The eco club has identified 48 different species of birds within the campus. The college has also adopted various environmental measures such as solar panels, solid waste management, small patch to grow vegetables organically among others to contribute positively to the environment.

Photocopying, Printing, Stationary and PCO/STD

Photocopying, scanning, printing and PCO/STD services are available on the campus on payment. The photocopy shop is the hub of all students before the semester exams to get notes scanned, printed and photocopied. One can also buy stationary items here.

Facilities for differently abled

We at Sri Venkateswara College, believe in diversity and one of the diverse population of the college constitutes differently abled. In order to suit the special needs of differently-abled persons the college has built ramps, rails and special toilets. These amenities make these students comfortable with the environment and help them perform well. Their well-being and performance is being well taken care of by the college.

Cafeteria

The college canteen is easily accessible from any corner of the campus. It is the epicenter of all student activities and discussions. Numerous delicious and healthy snacks are available here. Students often say that one is not a Venky student unless one has tried the 'Masala Dosa' and 'Utthappam'. Our canteen offers food from all parts of the country but in the past few years it has developed a reputation in South Campus for offering exquisite South Indian delicacies.

The canteen is the hotspot for all extra-circular activities, as well as the space for intellectual debates and free spirited conversations. The canteen has vast seating arrangement with an AC room for staff and visitors.

The College has also recently inaugurated a snack station, aptly named the Maggie Point. This new joint offers light refreshments like noodles, sandwiches and coffee. The snack bar is a great favourite with both the teachers and the students alike for something to catch in between the classes.



Our hostel was set up in 2009 and has two separate wings for boys and girls namely, Sri Balaji hostel for boys and Sri Padmavati hostel for girls.

Rooms are available on twin sharing basis. The hostel also provides the students with a reading room, a table tennis room and a recreational common room in both the hostels. The on-campus residential facility is available for full time outstation undergraduate students of the college. Students from nearby areas like NCR-Delhi, Ghaziabad, Greater Noida, Faridabad, Gurugram etc are not eligible for accommodation in the hostels.

Students seeking admission in the hostel must fill the hostel admission form available in the college website. The hostels are the live wire of the campus life. Many festivals and events are celebrated in the hostels such as Diwali, Holi, Independence day etc. Numerous sports and extra-curricular activities are also organized within the hostels on a regular basis.

The Principal is the Chairperson of the Hostel Committee. In case of any assistance or doubts the students must contact the Hostel Warden.

International Outreach

Sri Venkateswara College has MoUs with International Universities for academic and cultural exchange programs as part of its global outreach. SVC recently signed a joint agreement for cooperation in Bioinformatics with Martin Luther University, Halle-Wittenberg, Germany in February 2019. Our college also signed MoU for academic & cultural exchange with Nordic Centre, a consortium of 19 Universities in Sweden, Norway, Iceland, Denmark and Finland. These MoUs are anticipated to benefit the students immensely through exchange programs for research and training.

In the past year, we had visitors from the Lincoln University, the New Zealand and the Harvard Business School. Following the visit of eminent scholars and academicians, New Zealand - India Lecture Series was organized and Prof. Jennifer Brown, University of Canterbury, New Zealand delivered lecture in August, 2019 at SVC.













Apart from providing the most academically stimulating environments in the country, SVC also provides a rich cultural exposure to its students, allowing them to explore their talents, skills and make best use of the diverse opportunities.






To ignite curiosity in science and to inspire undergraduate students towards a career in research, SRI-VIPRA provides a platform for the students to design and execute small research projects in a particular discipline of their interest. In this internship program, under the supervision of mentors, they learn to apply the scientific methods to the processes of experimentation, hypothesis testing, data interpretation and logical conclusions. They also learn the significance of data reproducibility, quality control, maintaining record of results as well as requisite knowledge of laboratory safety.

Last year, 40 students enrolled under SRI VIPRA and underwent hands-on-training in various disciplines. Under the SRI-VIPRA 2020 program, 38 SVC mentors enrolled 280 students from science, humanities and commerce streams.

VISTAAR 2019 was organized on 1st November 2019 as a "One Day Popularization of Science" event under CTEP Scheme of the Department of Biotechnology, Govt. of India.

The occasion was graced by the presence of two eminent Educationists **Prof. L.S.Shashidhara**, IISER, Pune, visiting faculty in Ashoka University and **Dr. Pratibha Jolly**, Former Principal Miranda House, University of Delhi. The event was initiated with the traditional lighting of the lamp by the two distinguished guests and Principal **Dr. P. Hemalatha Reddy**.

The deep learning process facilitated through such a multipronged event is bound to have a lasting impact on students from middle, senior and undergraduate levels. Such a vision is critical for creating novel citizens for a better tomorrow.

Included four major events

1. Do-It-Yourself Laboratory

200 + students from both Government and Public schools participated in the demonstrations and hands-on experiments. Simultaneous work stations for all students encouraged collaborative learning. Experiments provided deep insight into some basic concepts of science. Interdisciplinary experiments, simple enough to be performed at home, were demonstrated and students carried the finished product home.

2. VISTAAR Exhibition

VISTAAR envisioned projecting Science as an interdisciplinary platform to bridge diverse fields of scientific studies. Thus, an exhibition was organized by participating Science departments. The stalls gave insights to the visiting students into various upcoming fields in Science and Technology. Within the stall a variety of activities were conducted ranging from static posters representative of the theme with associated demonstrations and hands-on activities incorporating cross-curricular challenges and games





3. Robowars

"Robowars" was launched as a pre-competition in different schools across Delhi-NCR. The theme of the competition was based on designing a "Line follower" robot. In all 12 different schools having 17 teams comprising of 2-3 students each registered after the pre-event announcement. A total of 25 participants (from nine teams) competed in the three rounds.

4. "Seeing the Unseen"

A Microscopy Competition was organised to help students consider science as a creative and enjoyable subject where they can make new discoveries. After multiple entries from the 18 participating schools, a preliminary screening was conducted and the 2 best entrants from each school were printed and displayed on the event day for final judgement. It was both heartening and illuminating to see the quality of slide preparation, photographs and the accompanying text explaining the displays.











Sri Venkateswara college in 2011 received the prestigious Star College grant from the Department of Biotechnology, Govt. of India. The college was also later in 2015 upgraded to the Star Status Scheme. This program has been initiated by DBT to support and improve undergraduate science teaching in colleges and universities across the country.

Under this flagship scheme the college saw a tremendous growth in instrument procurement that helped improve the 'hands on' training to students of all six science courses that are offered in our college. The scheme also helped strengthen the academic infrastructure wherein students and staff were able to experience intellectual freedom and creativity. The program also enhanced the quality of the teaching and learning process, and provided an avenue to stimulate original thinking and promote innovation.



This sensitivity has found expression in a number of innovative and productive measures that the students themselves come up with. We firmly believe in the potential of the students and give them a platform where they can become sensitive mentors for a better future of humanity.

NSS

The NSS unit at Sri Venkateswara has always risen up to the ideal of its motto "Not me but you". In view of the current pandemic, a special focus has been on the community at Sanjay Camp, an adopted community with NSS SVC. Other measures included using the virtual platforms for a pledge for Janta Curfew, plea for the safety of the corona warriors and promoting mental health and hygiene. Disseminating correct information and raising alarm against fake news and myths, the unit also worked hard to collect donations for the hard hit.

Apart from this NSS SVC also regularly organizes talks with prominent panelists and blood donation camps in the college. These events highlight the NSS SVC's contribution towards building a better society where we become informed citizens, who are aware of their rights and responsibilities.

THE ECO CLUB

The Eco Club of Sri Venkateswara College is a collective effort of passionate teachers and dedicated students who share a vision and sensitivity towards pressing environmental concerns. The Club organizes various programmes to facilitate both horizontal and vertical interactions between school children, environmental NGOs and researchers in the field of environment and ecology. The Green School Initiative, studying the adverse effect of air pollution is an example of this. The Club also has a Restoration Initiative, which spearheaded a study of the water pollution and a blueprint to clean the water body in the Aravali Biodiversity park. Interestingly, as many as 8 frog species were discovered in the process which was also captured as a short film titled 'Croaking Frogs'. The film went on to win the third prize in 'Films of Change 2020' award function. The Club also periodically organizes events in collaboration with prominent bodies such as Bombay Natural Historical Society (BNHS) and the Society for Environmental and Development (SED India). Sustainability has always been a prime focus for the Club, which has led to the setting up and maintenance of two compost pits within the college premises, making our campus a 'green' one indeed.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL

The Equal Opportunity Cell at Sri Venkateswara College aims at providing a space to the differently abled students where they are able to showcase the various talents that they have. These events can be diverse in nature involving competitions in poetry, chess, creative writing, quizzing and singing. While some of these are organised within the college premises, our students have also won laurels for us at various national and international meets. Remarkable achievements include representing the state of Delhi for the Nagesh Trophy in the National Cricket Tournament for the Blind and commendable participation in yoga competitions.

The Cell also organizes an annual trip for the students, a much awaited event in the college calendar for all involved with the society.

ENACTUS

Enactus aims at inculcating the spirit of entrepreneurship among the students. The members believe in finding opportunities and transforming them into real and sustainable projects so as to empower the underprivilegedall this while they create a pool of socially responsible students.

Enactus is successfully running a number of such projects. The Crimson Project, which went on to win the 2nd position in the Startup Showcase organized by the Maharaja Agarasen Institute of management Studies, provides reusable sanitary pads, at minimum or no costs to ensure healthy, hygienic and ecologically sustainable menstrual practices. Project Barqat, another initiative, aimed to improve the life of the urban poor through economically solar powered light.

The Solar powered Reverse Osmosis Plant, a new module, aims at providing portable water to the slum dwellers who have no access to clean drinking water. Such projects across the urban landscape of Delhi, highlight how Enactus strives towards bridging the gulf and making basic human amenities available to all.





SHAKTI - THE WOMEN'S DEVELOPMENT CELL

The aim of the Women's Development Cell is to create an awareness among the students and the society at large about the various issues which patriarchal conventions have made us internalize. The society regularly organizes talks by eminent personalities to engage with such issues. This year. renowned professors of the University of Delhi were invited to speak on the issues related to sexual harassment and its legal prospects, gender justice and patriarchy, amongst many others. A workshop on the important issue of Consent, was also organized in collaboration with Feminism in India (FII). Taking a step towards breaking the taboo attached to menstruation, the WDC launched an online campaign #MyFirstPeriod, where several women came forward to share their stories. The WDC also recognizes the need to celebrate gender diversity by organizing and participating in events such as panel discussions, Pride march, open mic etc. The Cell regularly screens national and international films and documentaries and encourages discussions with the resource persons.

Gopichandran, Assistant Professor, College of Nursing, AIIMS New Delhi.

Recently, Sri Venkateswara College's Department of Zoology in association with PhiXgen Pvt. Ltd. hosted an International E- Conference on "Health & Research in the current Scenario: with special emphasis on COVID-19 virus Genomics and Pathogenicity"on 17th July 2020. The conference was sponsored by the prestigious International Society of Microbial Ecology (ISME). The E-conference attempted to bring together scientists, academicians, researchers and students to spread important scientific thoughts regarding the Covid-19 virus and the ongoing research in the field.

Sri Venkateswara College's efforts during the pandemic have been much applauded and the college is keen to be resilient and dynamic in the ways to deal with it.


