## **Awareness Programme on “Prevention of HIV/AIDS”,**

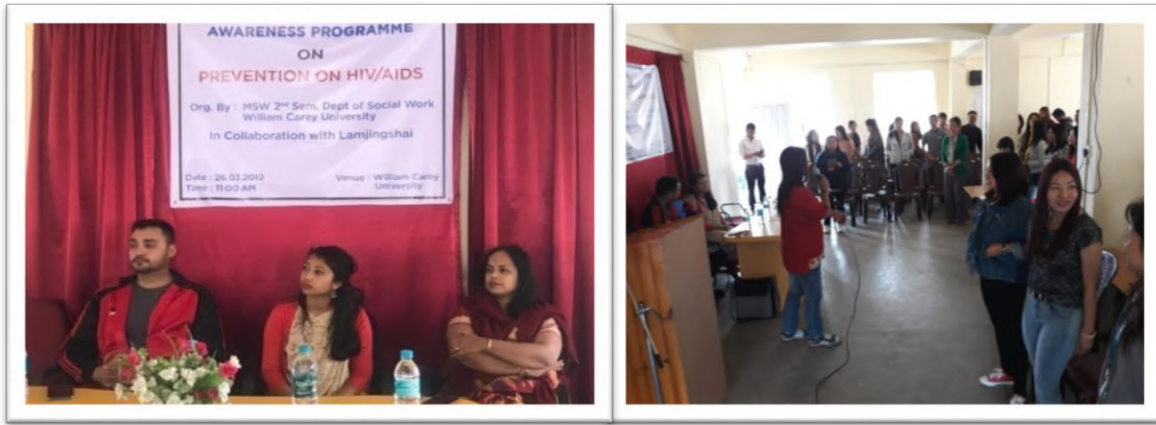

The programme was led by Chairy .R. Marak, MSW 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester student. Ma’am Samanda N Phanwar, Programme Manager, Lamjingshai and Mr Neil Khongwir, Counsellor, Manbha Foundation were the resource persons. Introduction of the resource persons was given by Weenalizia Lyngdoh Mawphlang, Assistant Professor, Social Work Department.

Mr Neil Khongwir spoke on the increasing rate in the number of youths indulging in drugs, with the main reason being peer pressure, lifestyle imitation and enjoyment which in turn takes a serious toll on their physical, mental, emotional and social well-being.

Ma’am Samanda N Phanwar started her session with an exercise game for the students. She talked about Human Immuno Virus (HIV) and Acquired Immuno Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS), its four modes of transmission and ways of preventing it. She urged the students on spreading awareness on HIV/AIDS and also encouraging them to get themselves tested for HIV especially before donating blood. She also stressed on the importance of safe sex. 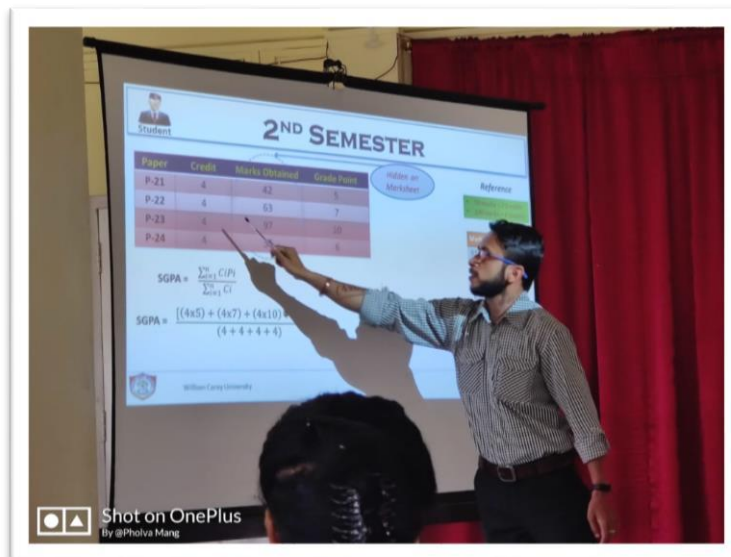

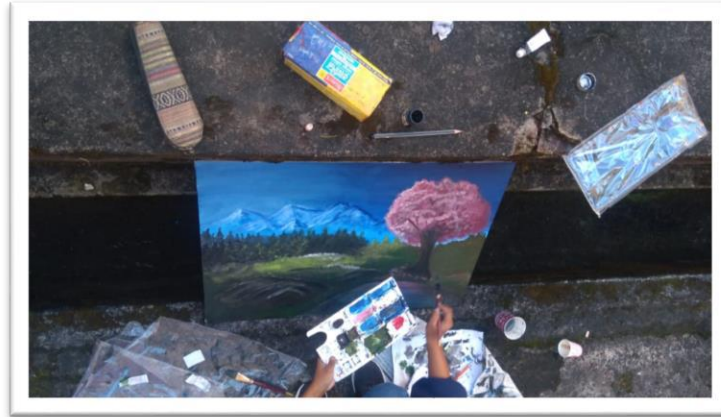

**Technical Session I** of the National Conference was Chaired by Dr. Soma Bhowmick, Registrar, William Carey University, and an invited lecture was delivered by Prof.(Dr.) Arupjyoti Choudhury, Registrar, Krishna Kanta Handiqui, State Open University, Guwahati. Dr. Choudhury spoke on “*Sarvodaya and the Mahatma*”, wherein he said that ‘Welfare’ is important, in India it is seen as ‘Sarvodaya’, but in the West it is seen as ‘Utilitarianism’. He stressed that Sarvodaya has three important features: (1) Decentralization (2) Balance between greed and need and (3) The question as how to achieve ‘Sarvodaya’. Dr. Choudhury concluded his lecture by saying that just as there is no ‘Calendar-date’ for a revolution, so also there is also no ‘calendar-date’ for Sarvodaya, it will come on its own with the practice of its Philosophy.

According to Dr. Noni Gandhiji's philosophical innovations were a significant point of dialectics within the nationalists that ignited a moment of contestation called 'Methodological Contest'. Further, strategic nationalism of Gandhiji had three innovations, to constitute an Indian self; an idea of welfares and decentralisation and thirdly; to contest Cambridge School of thoughts that did not consider Indians capable of Self-rule.

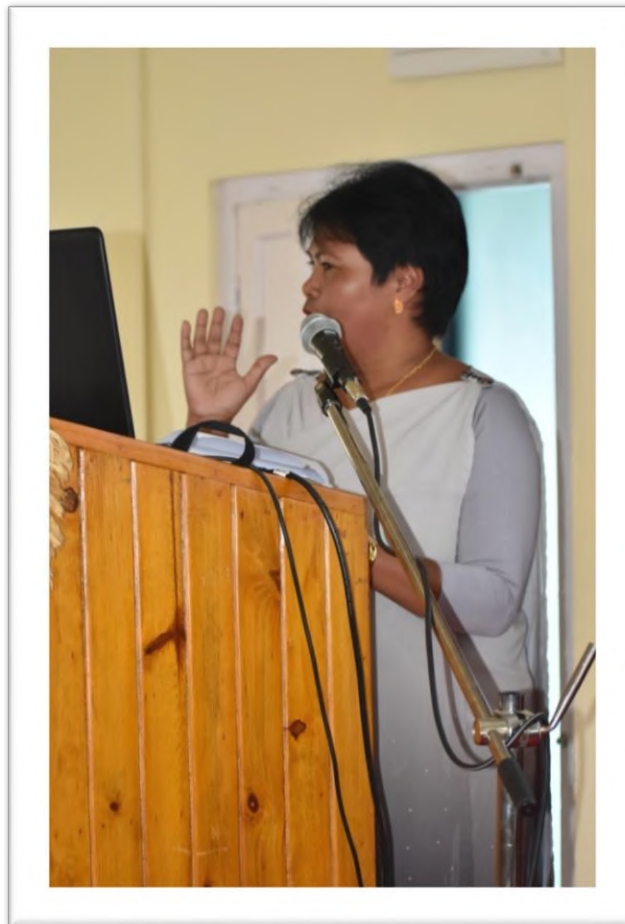

After a lengthy discussion on the Agendas several resolutions were taken in the meeting.

**NO. OF MINUTES:****NSS-Units in the University**

**NSS-WCU/ACM/2019/1-** Decided to start 02 Government aided NSS Units and 1 Self Finance Unit (SFU) in the University. Every unit should have 100 students. For these 3 Units, 2 villages should be adopted and 2 Program Officers are to be appointed.

**NSS-WCU/ACM/2019/2-** Decided that the University should enrol at least 100 students into the NSS every year. In total the University should maintain at least 200 volunteers/members every year.

**NSS-WCU/ACM/2019/3-** Decided the NSS unit to follow the standard NSS manual (Guideline) for its functioning.

**NSS-WCU/ACM/2019/5-** Decided to add NSS unit in the University Prospectus.

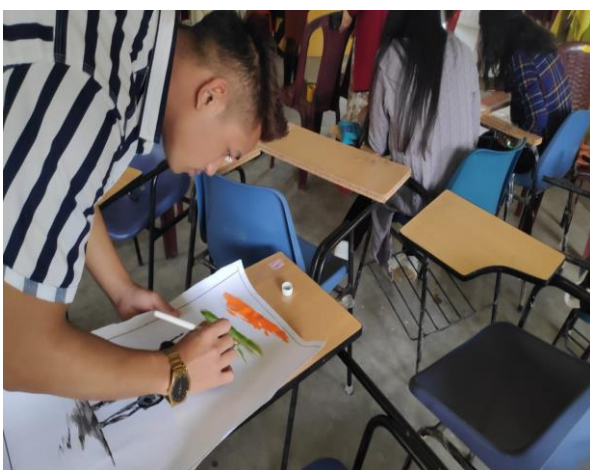
## GANDHI JAYANTI

Carey University whereby they picked up plastics and other waste along the highway which is outside the university campus.

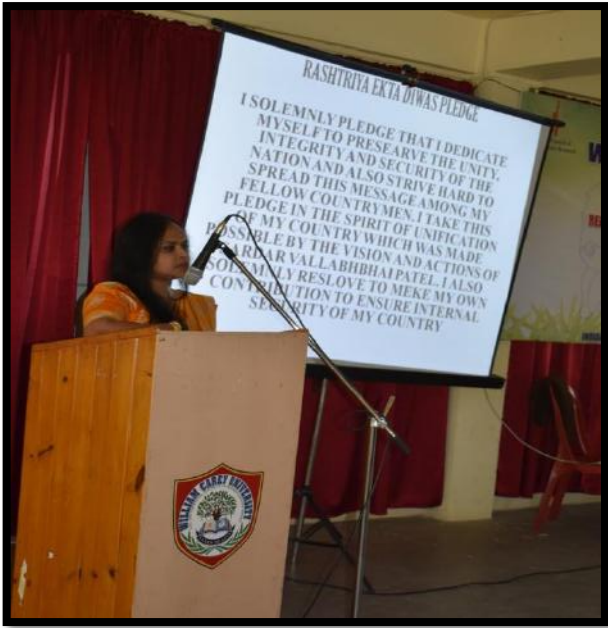


### **Rashtriya Ekta Diwas (National Unity Day) (31<sup>st</sup> of October 2019)**

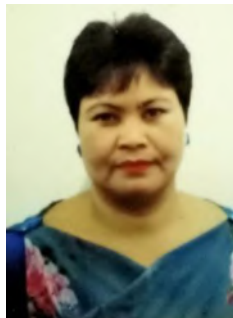

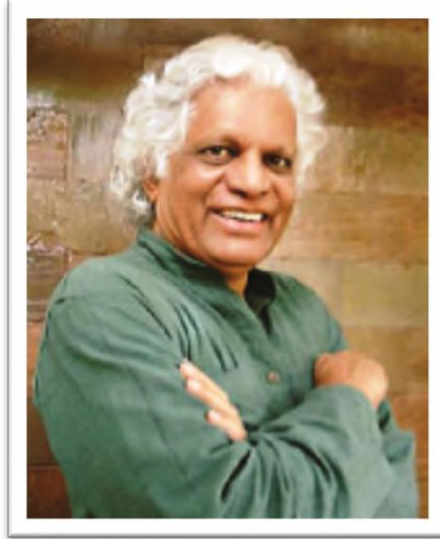
